<b>chthonic</b>	Relating to or inhabiting the underworld. <i>A <b>chthonic</b> deity.</i>
<b>correction</b>	A change that rectifies an error or inaccuracy. <i>The <b>correction</b> of his vision with eye glasses.</i>
<b><u>demon</u></b>	Someone extremely diligent or skillful. <i>She s a <b>demon</b> at math.</i>
<b><u>demonic</u></b>	Fiercely energetic or frenzied. <i>A <b>demonic</b> hurry.</i>
<b>derivation</b>	Drawing off water from its main channel as for irrigation. <i>Singer from sing or undo from do are examples of <b>derivations</b>.</i>
<b><u>derivative</u></b>	Resulting from or employing derivation. <i>Equity based <b>derivative</b> products.</i>
<b>devil</b>	Chief spirit of evil and adversary of God; tempter of mankind; master of Hell. <i>You lucky <b>devil</b>.</i>
<b>devilry</b>	Reckless or malicious behavior that causes discomfort or annoyance in others. <i>Some <b>devilry</b> was afoot.</i>
<b>diabolic</b>	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <i>Fires lit up a <b>diabolic</b> scene.</i>
<b><u>diabolical</u></b>	Disgracefully bad or unpleasant. <i>A singer with an absolutely <b>diabolical</b> voice.</i>
<b>exorcise</b>	Completely remove (something unpleasant) from one’s mind or memory. <i>Infants were <b>exorcised</b> prior to baptism.</i>
<b>fiend</b>	An evil spirit or demon. <i>Britain s most notorious sex <b>fiend</b>.</i>

<b>fiendish</b>	Extremely cruel or unpleasant. <i><b>Fiendish</b> methods of torture.</i>
<b>ghost</b>	Act as ghostwriter of a work. <i>I didn't want to <b>ghost</b> her so we ended up having the talk and it was horrible.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. <i>War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b>.</i>
<b>hydra</b>	(Greek mythology) monster with nine heads; when struck off each head was replaced by two new ones. <i>We may be facing a <b>hydra</b> that defies any easy solution.</i>
<b>infernal</b>	Being of the underworld. <i>The <b>infernal</b> regions.</i>
<b>language</b>	Coarse or offensive language. <i>The <b>language</b> of sociology.</i>
<b>lexicon</b>	A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words with information about them. <i>The size of the English <b>lexicon</b>.</i>
<b>malevolent</b>	Having or showing a wish to do evil to others. <i><b>Malevolent</b> stars.</i>
<b>maliciousness</b>	Feeling a need to see others suffer.
<b>perdition</b>	(Christianity) the abode of Satan and the forces of evil; where sinners suffer eternal punishment. <i>She used her last banknote to buy herself a square meal before <b>perdition</b>.</i>
<b>purgatory</b>	Mental anguish or suffering. <i>Infernal punishments are <b>purgatory</b> and medicinal.</i>
<b>sentence</b>	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>Her husband is serving a three year <b>sentence</b> for fraud.</i>
<b>spelling</b>	A person's ability to spell words. <i>Her <b>spelling</b> was deplorable.</i>
<b>translate</b>	Be translatable, or be translatable in a certain way. <i>I have to <b>translate</b> when my in laws from Austria visit the U S.</i>
<b>typo</b>	A typographical error.
<b>underworld</b>	The criminal class. <i>A prominent <b>underworld</b> figure.</i>
<b>vocabulary</b>	A language user's knowledge of words. <i>The <b>vocabulary</b> of law.</i>
