Island as a Noun

Definitions of "Island" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “island” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A traffic island.*
- *A detached portion of tissue or group of cells.*
- *A piece of land surrounded by water.*
- *A thing regarded as resembling an island, especially in being isolated, detached, or surrounded in some way.*
- *A free-standing kitchen unit with a worktop, allowing access from all sides.*
- *A land mass (smaller than a continent) that is surrounded by water.*
- *A zone or area resembling an island.*



Synonyms of "Island" as a noun (2 Words)

isle A small island.
*Crusoe's fabled **isle**.*

islet A portion of tissue structurally distinct from surrounding tissues.



Usage Examples of "Island" as a noun

- *The island of Crete.*
- *The university is the last island of democracy in this country.*
- *This island nation.*



Associations of "Island" (30 Words)

<u>archipelago</u>	A group of many islands in a large body of water. <i>The Indonesian archipelago.</i>
atlantic	The 2nd largest ocean; separates North and South America on the west from Europe and Africa on the east.
atoll	A ring-shaped reef, island, or chain of islands formed of coral.
<u>bay</u>	Utter in deep prolonged tones. <i>They put him in the sick bay.</i>
<u>coast</u>	A slope down which sleds may coast. <i>The coast is clear.</i>
coastal	Of or relating to a coast. <i>Coastal erosion.</i>
coral	The pinkish red colour of red coral. <i>A coral reef.</i>
<u>derelict</u>	A ship or other piece of property abandoned by the owner and in poor condition. <i>The barge lay derelict for years.</i>
<u>deserted</u>	Forsaken by owner or inhabitants. <i>Deserted beaches of soft sand.</i>

foreshore	The part of a shore between high- and low-water marks, or between the water and cultivated or developed land.
gulf	A deep inlet of the sea almost surrounded by land, with a narrow mouth. <i>He felt a gulf between himself and his former friends.</i>
insular	Relating to the insula of the brain. <i>Insular attitudes toward foreigners.</i>
isle	A small island. <i>Crusoe s fabled isle.</i>
islet	A small island.
isthmus	A cord-like tissue connecting two larger parts of an anatomical structure.
kelp	Large brown seaweeds having fluted leathery fronds. <i>There are several kelps found in the lower zones.</i>
lagoon	A stretch of salt water separated from the sea by a low sandbank or coral reef.
maritime	Bordering on the sea. <i>A maritime museum.</i>
nautical	Relating to or involving ships or shipping or navigation or seamen. <i>Nautical charts.</i>
northernmost	Situated farthest north. <i>The northernmost island of the Philippines.</i>
ocean	The sea. <i>They scramble across the beach to the ocean and plunge into the surf.</i>
offshore	Situated at sea some distance from the shore. <i>Big businesses in most cases pay little or no tax if they are registered offshore.</i>
peninsula	A large mass of land projecting into a body of water.
peninsular	Of or forming or resembling a peninsula. <i>The counties of peninsular Florida.</i>
reef	Reduce a sail by taking in a reef. <i>Reef the sailboat s mast.</i>
seabed	The ground under the sea; the ocean floor.
seashore	The land between high- and low-water marks.
seaweed	Large algae growing in the sea or on rocks below the high-water mark. <i>Seaweed glistened on the rocks.</i>
shellfish	Shellfish as food. <i>They plied me with enormous platters of fresh shellfish.</i>
