- A traffic island.
- A detached portion of tissue or group of cells.

- A thing regarded as resembling an island, especially in being isolated, detached, or surrounded in some way.
- A free-standing kitchen unit with a worktop, allowing access from all sides.
- A land mass (smaller than a continent) that is surrounded by water.
- A zone or area resembling an island.

northernmost Situated farthest north.
