Past Tense	italianated
Present Participle	italianating
Past Participle	italianated

# **Conjugate Italianate**

### Italianate in Present Simple (Indefinite) Tense



Singular	Plural
I <b>italianate</b>	We <b>italianate</b>
You <b>italianate</b>	You <b>italianate</b>
He/She/It <b>italianates</b>	They <b>italianate</b>

## **Italianate in Present Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

Singular	Plural
I am italianating	We <b>are italianating</b>
You <b>are italianating</b>	You <b>are italianating</b>
He/She/It is italianating	They are italianating

#### **Italianate in Present Perfect Tense**

Singular	Plural
I have italianated	We have italianated
You have italianated	You have italianated
He/She/It has italianated	They have italianated

### **Italianate in Present Perfect Continuous Tense**

Singular	Plural
I have been italianating	We <b>have been italianating</b>
You <b>have been italianating</b>	You <b>have been italianating</b>
He/She/It has been italianating	They have been italianating

## **Italianate in Past Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

Singular	Plural
I italianated	We <b>italianated</b>
You <b>italianated</b>	You <b>italianated</b>
He/She/It <b>italianated</b>	They <b>italianated</b>

## **Italianate in Past Continuous (Progressive) Tense**



Singular	Plural
I was italianating	We were italianating
You <b>were italianating</b>	You were italianating
He/She/It was italianating	They were italianating

#### **Italianate in Past Perfect Tense**

Singular	Plural
I had italianated	We had italianated
You <b>had italianated</b>	You had italianated
He/She/It had italianated	They had italianated

#### **Italianate in Past Perfect Continuous Tense**

Singular	Plural
I had been italianating	We <b>had been italianating</b>
You <b>had been italianating</b>	You <b>had been italianating</b>
He/She/It had been italianating	They had been italianating

## **Italianate in Future Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

Singular	Plural
I will italianate	We <b>will italianate</b>
You <b>will italianate</b>	You <b>will italianate</b>
He/She/It will italianate	They will italianate

## **Italianate in Future Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

Singular	Plural
I will be italianating	We <b>will be italianating</b>
You <b>will be italianating</b>	You will be italianating
He/She/It will be italianating	They will be italianating

Singular	Plural
I will have been italianating	We <b>will have been italianating</b>
You <b>will have been italianating</b>	You <b>will have been italianating</b>
He/She/It will have been italianating	They will have been italianating
