Definitions of "Jab" as a noun

- *The act of touching someone suddenly with your finger or elbow.*
- *A hypodermic injection, especially a vaccination.*
- *A quick short straight punch.*
- *A sharp hand gesture (resembling a blow).*
- *A sharp, painful sensation or feeling.*
- *A quick, sharp blow, especially with the fist.*

Synonyms of "Jab" as a noun (19 Words)

booster

A device for increasing electrical voltage or signal strength.
A **booster** injection.

dig	An act or spell of digging. <i>She never missed an opportunity to have a dig at him.</i>
elbow	A thing resembling an elbow in particular a piece of piping bent through an angle. <i>She propped herself up on one elbow.</i>
immunization	The action of making a person or animal immune to infection, typically by inoculation. <i>We recommend influenza immunization for all employees.</i>
injection	The entry or placing of a spacecraft or other object into an orbit or trajectory. <i>A morphine injection.</i>
inoculation	Taking a vaccine as a precaution against contracting a disease. <i>A course of inoculations.</i>
jabbing	A sharp hand gesture (resembling a blow).
jolt	An abrupt spasmodic movement. <i>All the jars and jolts were smoothed out by the shock absorbers.</i>
nudge	A slight push or shake. <i>She appreciated the nudge to her memory.</i>
poke	A sharp hand gesture (resembling a blow). <i>She gave the fire a poke.</i>
poking	A sharp hand gesture (resembling a blow).
punch	An iced mixed drink usually containing alcohol and prepared for multiple servings normally served in a punch bowl. <i>He reeled under the well aimed punch.</i>
shove	The act of shoving (giving a push to someone or something). <i>He gave the door a shove.</i>
tap	A taproom. <i>The air supply tap.</i>
thrusting	A sharp hand gesture (resembling a blow). <i>He made a thrusting motion with his fist.</i>
vaccination	The scar left following inoculation with a vaccine. <i>If you think you need a flu vaccination check with your doctor.</i>

- A jab of envy.
- He warned me with a jab with his finger.
- An anti-tetanus jab.

- *A jab in the stomach.*

Jab as a Verb

Definitions of "Jab" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "jab" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Roughly or quickly thrust (a sharp or pointed object) someone or something.*
- *Poke or thrust abruptly.*
- *Stab or pierce.*
- *Poke roughly or quickly, especially with something sharp or pointed.*
- *Strike or punch with quick and short blows.*

Synonyms of "Jab" as a verb (18 Words)

dig	Remove harvest or recover by digging. <i>Dig your foot into the floor.</i>
drive	Strike with a driver as in teeing off. <i>Nails are driven through the boards.</i>
elbow	Move by pushing past people with one's elbows. <i>One player had elbowed another in the face.</i>
force	Take by force. <i>The plane might have been forced down by fighters.</i>
jolt	Disturb (someone's) composure. <i>A surge in the crowd behind him jolted him forwards.</i>
nudge	Coax or gently encourage (someone) to do something. <i>We have to nudge the politicians in the right direction.</i>
poke	Prod and stir a fire with a poker to make it burn more fiercely. <i>They sniffed felt and poked at everything they bought.</i>
punch	Drive forcibly as if by a punch. <i>The nail punched through the wall.</i>
push	Make strenuous pushing movements during birth to expel the baby. <i>The liberal party pushed for reforms.</i>
ram	Undergo damage or destruction on impact. <i>The stolen car rammed into the front of the house.</i>

- shove** Used to express angry dismissal of something.
*She **shoved** the books into her briefcase.*
- sink** Fall or sink heavily.
*The players were **sinking** a few post match lagers.*
- stab** Stab or pierce.
*A stitch **stabbed** at her side.*
- stick** Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist separation.
***Stick** the photo onto the corkboard.*
- tap** Make light repeated taps on a surface.
***Tap** beer in a bar.*

Usage Examples of "Jab" as a verb

- *She jabbed the fork into the earth.*
- *He jabbed the piece of meat with his pocket knife.*
- *She jabbed him in his ribs.*
- *He jabbed at the air with his finger.*
- *He jabbed his finger into her ribs.*
