Jab as a Verb

Definitions of "Jab" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "jab" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Roughly or quickly thrust (a sharp or pointed object) someone or something.
- Poke or thrust abruptly.
- Stab or pierce.
- Poke roughly or quickly, especially with something sharp or pointed.
- Strike or punch with quick and short blows.

They sniffed felt and **poke**d at everything they bought.

punch Drive forcibly as if by a punch.

The nail **punch**ed through the wall.

Make strenuous pushing movements during birth to expel the baby.

The liberal party **push**ed for reforms.

ram
Undergo damage or destruction on impact.
The stolen car rammed into the front of the house.



shove Used to express angry dismissal of something.

She **shove**d the books into her briefcase.

sink Fall or sink heavily.

The players were **sink**ing a few post match lagers.

stab Stab or pierce.

A stitch **stab**bed at her side.

stick Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist separation.

Stick the photo onto the corkboard.

Make light repeated taps on a surface.

Tap beer in a bar.

Usage Examples of "Jab" as a verb

• *She jabbed the fork into the earth.*

- He jabbed the piece of meat with his pocket knife.
- She jabbed him in his ribs.
- He jabbed at the air with his finger.
- He jabbed his finger into her ribs.
