Definitions of "Jagged" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “jagged” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed.*
- *Having a sharply uneven surface or outline.*
- *With rough, sharp points protruding.*



Synonyms of "Jagged" as an adjective (16 Words)

barbed	Having or covered with protective barbs or quills or spines or thorns or setae etc. <i>Barbed arrows.</i>
<u>broken</u>	Having been broken. <i>He pressed onwards over the broken ground.</i>
craggy	Having hills and crags. <i>A craggy coastline.</i>
erose	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed.
<u>irregular</u>	Lacking continuity or regularity. <i>An irregular heartbeat.</i>
jaggy	Prickly. <i>A jaggy sweater.</i>
notched	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Notched bamboo sticks.</i>

pointed	Having a sharpened or tapered tip or end. <i>His face tapers to a pointed chin.</i>
ragged	Suffering from exhaustion or stress. <i>Hered the class into a ragged line.</i>
rough	Violently agitated and turbulent. <i>Rough gemstones.</i>
scraggy	(of a person or animal) thin and bony. <i>Scraggy mongrels.</i>
snaggy	Having sharp, angular, or jagged projections. <i>His teeth were snaggy and broken.</i>
spiked	Having a long sharp point.
spiky	Having or as if having especially high-pitched spots. <i>His hair was dark and spiky.</i>
toothed	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Saw toothed.</i>
<u>uneven</u>	Not fairly matched as opponents. <i>Uneven spacing.</i>



Usage Examples of "Jagged" as an adjective

- *The jagged edges gashed their fingers.*
- *The jagged outline of the crags.*
- *Her jagged nerves.*



Associations of "Jagged" (30 Words)

approximative	(of a method, description, etc.) giving only an approximation to something. <i>A crudely approximative outline.</i>
asperity	Harshness of tone or manner. <i>The asperity of northern winters.</i>
asymmetric	Characterized by asymmetry in the spatial arrangement or placement of parts or components.
<u>bumpy</u>	(of a journey or other movement) involving sudden jolts and jerks. <i>A bumpy country road.</i>
craggy	(of a man's face) rugged and rough-textured in an attractive way. <i>A craggy coastline.</i>
<u>erratic</u>	Having no fixed course. <i>Erratic winds are the bane of a sailor.</i>
<u>grating</u>	Unpleasantly harsh or grating in sound. <i>The continual praise of the good old days can become grating.</i>
gravelly	Resembling, containing, or consisting of gravel. <i>A dry gravelly soil.</i>

hilly	Having many hills. Hilly terrain.
hinterland	A remote and undeveloped area. A market town serving its rich agricultural hinterland .
imprecise	Not precise. The witness could give only vague and imprecise descriptions.
inexact	Not exact. An inexact description.
jag	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. He clutched a jag of the rock.
lined	Marked or covered with lines. Their lined faces were immeasurably sad.
mountainous	Very large; huge. Mountainous waves.
patchy	Irregular or uneven in quality, texture, etc. Patchy fog.
ragged	(of cloth or clothes) old and torn. He looked a little ragged a little shadowy beneath the eyes.
rugged	(of ground or terrain) having a broken, rocky, and uneven surface. Rugged ground.
serrate	Serrated. Leaves with serrate margins.
serrated	Notched like a saw with teeth pointing toward the apex. A knife with a serrated edge.
sharply	With a sudden, piercing physical sensation or effect; intensely. Prices rose sharply .
sketchy	(of a picture) resembling a sketch; consisting of outline without much detail. A sketchy neighbourhood.
stony	(of a meteorite) consisting mostly of rock, as opposed to metal. Rough stony paths.
toothed	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. Saw toothed .
unbalance	A lack of symmetry, balance, or stability. This sharing can often unbalance even the closest of relationships.
uneven	Lacking consistency. Uneven spacing.

unfinished

Not brought to the desired final state.

*The building is still **unfinished**.*

unkind

Inconsiderate and harsh to others.

*The **unkindest** cut of all.*

wavy

Divided or edged with a line formed of alternating shallow curves.

*The leaf has a **wavy** edge.*
