## Jeopardize as a Verb

### Definitions of "Jeopardize" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “jeopardize” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Pose a threat to; present a danger to.*
- *Put at risk.*
- *Put (someone or something) into a situation in which there is a danger of loss, harm, or failure.*

### Synonyms of "Jeopardize" as a verb (17 Words)

<b>adventure</b>	Engage in daring or risky activity. <i>They had <b>adventured</b> into the forest.</i>
<b><a href="#">endanger</a></b>	Put (someone or something) at risk or in danger. <i>The pollution is <b>endangering</b> the crops.</i>
<b>expose to danger</b>	To show, make visible or apparent.
<b>expose to risk</b>	Remove all or part of one’s clothes to show one’s body.
<b><a href="#">hazard</a></b>	Put forward, of a guess, in spite of possible refutation. <i>He <b>hazarded</b> a guess.</i>

<b>imperil</b>	Pose a threat to; present a danger to. <i>They advised against tax increases for fear of <b>imperilling</b> the recovery.</i>
<b>jeopardise</b>	Pose a threat to; present a danger to.
<b><u>menace</u></b>	Express a threat either by an utterance or a gesture. <i>He <b>menaced</b> the bank manager with a stick.</i>
<b>peril</b>	Put in a dangerous, disadvantageous, or difficult position. <i>Jonathon <b>perilled</b> his life for love of David.</i>
<b>put at risk</b>	Attribute or give.
<b>put in danger</b>	Attribute or give.
<b>put in jeopardy</b>	Formulate in a particular style or language.
<b>put on the line</b>	Make an investment.
<b>risk</b>	Take a risk in the hope of a favorable outcome. <i>Shelley was far too intelligent to <b>risk</b> attempting to deceive him.</i>
<b><u>stake</u></b>	Support a plant with a stake or stakes. <i><b>Stake</b> your goat.</i>
<b>threaten</b>	To utter intentions of injury or punishment against. <i>How dare you <b>threaten</b> me.</i>
<b>venture</b>	Undertake a risky or daring journey or course of action. <i>May I <b>venture</b> to add a few comments.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Jeopardize" as a verb

- A devaluation of the dollar would jeopardize New York's position as a financial centre.

## Associations of "Jeopardize" (30 Words)

<b>aftershock</b>	A tremor (or one of a series of tremors) occurring after the main shock of an earthquake.
<b>avalanche</b>	Engulf or carry off by an avalanche. <i>We have had an <b>avalanche</b> of applications for the post.</i>
<b>carelessly</b>	In a rakish manner. <i>He replied <b>carelessly</b>.</i>
<b><u>crisis</u></b>	A crucial stage or turning point in the course of something. <i>The monarchy was in <b>crisis</b>.</i>
<b>danger</b>	A dangerous place. <i>One of the trains involved passed a signal at <b>danger</b>.</i>

<b>dare</b>	To be courageous enough to try or do something. <i>I don't <b>dare</b> call him.</i>
<b><u>endanger</u></b>	Put (someone or something) at risk or in danger. <i>The pollution is <b>endangering</b> the crops.</i>
<b>firefighter</b>	A person whose job is to extinguish fires.
<b>flammability</b>	The quality of being easily ignited and burning rapidly.
<b><u>forewarn</u></b>	Inform (someone) of a possible future danger or problem. <i>I <b>forewarned</b> him of the trouble that would arise if he showed up at his ex wife's house.</i>
<b><u>gamble</u></b>	Money that is risked for possible monetary gain. <i>Dad likes a bit of a <b>gamble</b>.</i>
<b><u>hazard</u></b>	A gambling game using two dice, in which the chances are complicated by arbitrary rules. <i>He <b>hazarded</b> a guess.</i>
<b><u>hazardous</u></b>	Risky; dangerous. <i>We work in <b>hazardous</b> conditions.</i>
<b>imminence</b>	The state of being imminent and liable to happen soon. <i>The populace was largely unaware of the <b>imminence</b> of war.</i>
<b>jeopardy</b>	Danger arising from being on trial for a criminal offence. <i>The whole peace process is in <b>jeopardy</b>.</i>
<b>landslide</b>	A collapse of a mass of earth or rock from a mountain or cliff. <i>Roosevelt defeated Hoover in a <b>landslide</b>.</i>
<b><u>menace</u></b>	Express a threat either by an utterance or a gesture. <i>The snakes are a <b>menace</b> to farm animals.</i>
<b>parlous</b>	Fraught with danger. <i>The General's position was <b>parlous</b>.</i>
<b>peril</b>	Put in a dangerous, disadvantageous, or difficult position. <i>You could well place us both in <b>peril</b>.</i>
<b><u>perilous</u></b>	Full of danger or risk. <i>A <b>perilous</b> voyage across the Atlantic in a small boat.</i>
<b>risk</b>	Take a risk in the hope of a favorable outcome. <i>Why <b>risk</b> your life.</i>
<b><u>risky</u></b>	Not financially safe or secure. <i>It was much too <b>risky</b> to try to disarm him.</i>
<b>threat</b>	A person who inspires fear or dread. <i>Thousands of rail freight jobs came under <b>threat</b>.</i>

<b>threaten</b>	To utter intentions of injury or punishment against. <i>She forced a scene and Toby <b>threatened</b> to leave.</i>
<b>threatened</b>	Likely in the near future to become endangered. <i>The spotted owl is a <b>threatened</b> species not yet an endangered one.</i>
<u>toxicity</u>	The degree to which something is poisonous. <i>That was how I protected my partner from my family's <b>toxicity</b>.</i>
<b>unsafe</b>	Lacking in security or safety. <i>Drinking water in some areas may be <b>unsafe</b>.</i>
<b>venture</b>	Any venturesome undertaking especially one with an uncertain outcome. <i>We <b>ventured</b> into the world of high tech and bought a supercomputer.</i>
<b>volatility</b>	Liability to change rapidly and unpredictably, especially for the worse. <i>The succession of new rulers contributed to the <b>volatility</b> of the situation.</i>
<u>warn</u>	Notify, usually in advance. <i>I <b>warned</b> you that I would ask some difficult questions.</i>
