- *A professional joker or ‘fool’ at a medieval court, typically wearing a cap with bells on it and carrying a mock sceptre.*

buffoon	A ridiculous but amusing person; a clown.
character	A characteristic especially one that assists in the identification of a species. <i>The actor's TV character is often on the wrong side of the law.</i>
clown	A rude or vulgar fool. <i>A circus clown.</i>
comedian	An actor in a comedy. <i>A stand up comedian.</i>
comic	Comic strips. <i>He is training as a stand up comic.</i>
court fool	An area wholly or partly surrounded by walls or buildings.
court jester	The sovereign and his advisers who are the governing power of a state.
fool	A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of. <i>He is the fool of circumstances.</i>
funny man	An account of an amusing incident (usually with a punch line).
funny woman	An account of an amusing incident (usually with a punch line).
humorist	A humorous writer, performer, or artist. <i>The world's best humorists and cartoonists.</i>
joker	A playing card, typically bearing the figure of a jester, used in some games as a wild card. <i>When I demanded my money he showed me the joker in the contract.</i>
jokester	A person who enjoys telling or playing jokes. <i>He was an outgoing fun loving kid the family jokester.</i>
motley fool	A garment made of motley (especially a court jester's costume).
prankster	A person fond of playing pranks.
wag	A single rapid movement from side to side. <i>A chirpy wag of the head.</i>
wit	A witty amusing person who makes jokes. <i>He needed all his wits to figure out the way back.</i>
