### Definitions of "Jester" as a noun

- *A professional clown employed to entertain a king or nobleman in the Middle Ages.*
- *A person who habitually plays the fool.*
- *A professional joker or ‘fool’ at a medieval court, typically wearing a cap with bells on it and carrying a mock sceptre.*



## Synonyms of "Jester" as a noun (17 Words)

<b>buffoon</b>	A ridiculous but amusing person; a clown.
<b>character</b>	A characteristic especially one that assists in the identification of a species. <i>The actor's TV <b>character</b> is often on the wrong side of the law.</i>
<b>clown</b>	A rude or vulgar fool. <i>A circus <b>clown</b>.</i>
<b>comedian</b>	An actor in a comedy. <i>A stand up <b>comedian</b>.</i>
<b>comic</b>	Comic strips. <i>He is training as a stand up <b>comic</b>.</i>
<b>court fool</b>	An area wholly or partly surrounded by walls or buildings.
<b>court jester</b>	The sovereign and his advisers who are the governing power of a state.
<b>fool</b>	A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of. <i>He is the <b>fool</b> of circumstances.</i>
<b>funny man</b>	An account of an amusing incident (usually with a punch line).
<b>funny woman</b>	An account of an amusing incident (usually with a punch line).
<b>humorist</b>	A humorous writer, performer, or artist. <i>The world's best <b>humorists</b> and cartoonists.</i>
<b>joker</b>	A playing card, typically bearing the figure of a jester, used in some games as a wild card. <i>When I demanded my money he showed me the <b>joker</b> in the contract.</i>
<b>jokester</b>	A person who enjoys telling or playing jokes. <i>He was an outgoing fun loving kid the family <b>jokester</b>.</i>
<b>motley fool</b>	A garment made of motley (especially a court jester's costume).
<b>prankster</b>	A person fond of playing pranks.
<b>wag</b>	A single rapid movement from side to side. <i>A chirpy <b>wag</b> of the head.</i>
<b>wit</b>	A witty amusing person who makes jokes. <i>He needed all his <b>wits</b> to figure out the way back.</i>
