buffoon A ridiculous but amusing person; a clown.

character A characteristic especially one that assists in the identification of a species.

The actor s TV **character** is often on the wrong side of the law.

clown A rude or vulgar fool.

A circus clown.

comedian An actor in a comedy.

A stand up comedian.

comic Comic strips.

He is training as a stand up **comic**.

court fool An area wholly or partly surrounded by walls or buildings.

court jester The sovereign and his advisers who are the governing power of a state.

A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of.

He is the **fool** of circumstances.

funny man An account of an amusing incident (usually with a punch line. **funny woman** An account of an amusing incident (usually with a punch line.

humorist A humorous writer, performer, or artist.

The world s best **humorist**s and cartoonists.

A playing card, typically bearing the figure of a jester, used in some games

joker as a wild card.

When I demanded my money he showed me the **joker** in the contract.

jokester A person who enjoys telling or playing jokes.

He was an outgoing fun loving kid the family **jokester**.

motley fool A garment made of motley (especially a court jester's costume.

prankster A person fond of playing pranks.

A single rapid movement from side to side.

A chirpy **wag** of the head.

wit A witty amusing person who makes jokes.

He needed all his wits to figure out the way back.
