## **Joking as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Joking" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “joking” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Characterized by jokes and good humor.*
- *Humorous or flippant.*



### Synonyms of "Joking" as an adjective (3 Words)

**jesting** Said or done for amusement; joking.  
A **jesting** commentary on world affairs.

**jocose** Playful or humorous.  
A **jocose** allusion.

**jocular** Fond of or characterized by joking; humorous or playful.  
She sounded in a **jocular** mood.





## Usage Examples of "Joking" as an adjective

- *A joking manner.*



## Associations of "Joking" (30 Words)

- badinage** Frivolous banter.  
*He developed a nice line in **badinage** with the Labour leader.*
- banter** Exchange remarks in a good-humoured teasing way.  
*There was much good natured **banter**.*
- comedy** The style or genre represented by comedy films plays and broadcast programmes.  
*Advertising people see the **comedy** in their work.*
- deride** Express contempt for; ridicule.  
*The decision was **derided** by environmentalists.*
- fun** A source of fun.  
*No need to get sore I was only **funning**.*
- funny** Slightly but undefinably unwell.  
*There was something **funny** going on.*



<b>gibe</b>	Laugh at with contempt and derision. <i>Some cynics in the media might <b>gibe</b>.</i>
<b>hoot</b>	Of an owl utter a hoot. <i>Your mum s a real <b>hoot</b>.</i>
<b>humor</b>	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>He was in a bad <b>humor</b>.</i>
<b>humorous</b>	Causing laughter and amusement; comic. <i><b>Humorous</b> cartoons.</i>
<b>humour</b>	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>His tales are full of <b>humour</b>.</i>
<b>jeer</b>	A rude and mocking remark. <i>Councillors were <b>jeered</b> and heckled.</i>
<b>jest</b>	A thing said or done for amusement; a joke. <i>He laughed unpleasantly at his own <b>jest</b>.</i>
<b>jocose</b>	Playful or humorous. <i>A <b>jocose</b> allusion.</i>
<b>jocular</b>	Characterized by jokes and good humor. <i>His voice was <b>jocular</b>.</i>
<b>laugh</b>	An act of laughing. <i>If next year s model is as successful Ford will be <b>laughing</b>.</i>
<b>mockery</b>	Ludicrously futile action. <i>After a <b>mockery</b> of a trial in London he was executed.</i>
<b>parody</b>	Make a parody of. <i>His speciality was <b>parodying</b> schoolgirl fiction.</i>
<b>persiflage</b>	Light teasing. <i>An air of <b>persiflage</b>.</i>
<b>playfully</b>	In a playful manner. <i>Lily laughed and <b>playfully</b> slapped him across the chest.</i>
<b>quip</b>	Make jokes or quips. <i>Peter ate heartily with a <b>quip</b> about being a condemned man.</i>
<b>repartee</b>	Adroitness and cleverness in reply. <i>Quick fire <b>repartee</b>.</i>
<b>ridicule</b>	Subject to laughter or ridicule. <i>His theory was <b>ridiculed</b> and dismissed.</i>
<b>sally</b>	A sudden charge out of a besieged place against the enemy; a sortie. <i>The garrison there made a <b>sally</b> against us.</i>

**satirize** Deride and criticize by means of satire.  
*The writer **satirized** the politician's proposal.*

**scoff** Showing your contempt by derision.  
***Scoffs** of disbelief.*

**slapstick** Acoustic device consisting of two paddles hinged together; used by an actor to make a loud noise without inflicting injury when striking someone.  
***Slapstick** style of humor.*

**spoof** Interfere with (radio or radar signals) so as to make them useless.  
*They proceeded to **spoof** Western intelligence with false information.*

**teasing** Intended to provoke or make fun of someone in a playful way.  
***Teasing** comments.*

**witticism** A witty remark.  
*Maurice roared with laughter at his own **witticisms**.*
