Synonyms of "Joyous" as an adjective (26 Words)

<u>airy</u>	Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air. <i>Airy gauze curtains.</i>
beaming	Cheerful and bright. <i>A beaming smile.</i>
breezy	Abounding in or exposed to the wind or breezes. <i>The text is written in a breezy matter of fact manner.</i>
<u>bright</u>	Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing reflecting a sheen or glow. <i>A bright sunlit room.</i>
<u>bubbly</u>	Emitting or filled with bubbles as from carbonation or fermentation. <i>A bright and bubbly personality.</i>
<u>cheerful</u>	Causing happiness by its nature or appearance. <i>Her cheerful nature.</i>

cheery	Bright and pleasant; promoting a feeling of cheer. <i>A cheery hello.</i>
ebullient	Cheerful and full of energy. <i>Misted and ebullient seas.</i>
effervescent	Used of wines and waters; charged naturally or artificially with carbon dioxide. <i>His fertile effervescent mind.</i>
exuberant	Unrestrained, especially with regard to feelings. <i>Exuberant over the top sculptures.</i>
grinning	Smiling broadly. <i>She looked at Mick s grinning face.</i>
happy	Well expressed and to the point. <i>I m happy with his performance.</i>
in good spirits	Currently fashionable.
in high spirits	Directed or bound inward.
jaunty	Having or expressing a lively, cheerful, and self-confident manner. <i>There was no mistaking that jaunty walk.</i>
jolly	Happy and cheerful. <i>The jolly crowd at the reunion.</i>
joyful	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i>Make a joyful noise.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
light-hearted	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
merry	Cheerful and lively. <i>After the third beer he began to feel quite merry.</i>
mirthful	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>A mirthful laugh.</i>
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>Plants convert the radiant energy of the sun into chemical energy.</i>
smiling	Smiling with happiness or optimism Lewis Carroll. <i>It s nice to see everyone s smiling faces.</i>
sparkling	Shining brightly with flashes of light. <i>Her sparkling blue eyes.</i>
sprightly	(especially of an old person) lively; full of energy. <i>A sprightly dance.</i>

Bright and pleasant; promoting a feeling of cheer.
A **sunny** smile.

beatitude	Supreme blessedness. <i>The expression of beatitude the religious sometimes adopt.</i>
blessedness	The state of being blessed with divine favour.
delighted	Greatly pleased. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>
<u>ecstatic</u>	Involving an experience of mystic self-transcendence. <i>Ecstatic fans filled the stadium.</i>
elated	Exultantly proud and joyful; in high spirits. <i>The elated winner.</i>

enjoy	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. <i>The security forces enjoy legal immunity from prosecution.</i>
enjoyable	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>They had an enjoyable afternoon.</i>
enraptured	Feeling great rapture or delight.
euphoria	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his euphoria he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
euphoric	Characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness. <i>A euphoric sense of freedom.</i>
exultant	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
felicity	Pleasing and appropriate manner or style (especially manner or style of expression). <i>Domestic felicity.</i>
festal	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>Plum pudding was originally served on festal days as a main course.</i>
festive	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>The festive season is fast approaching.</i>
glad	Willing and eager (to do something). <i>I m really glad to hear that.</i>
gladness	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
happy	Eagerly disposed to act or to be of service. <i>Melissa came in looking happy and excited.</i>
hilarious	Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. <i>The meal was noisy and hilarious.</i>
jollity	Feeling jolly and jovial and full of good humor. <i>A night of riotous jollity.</i>
jolly	Encourage (someone) in a friendly way. <i>We had a very jolly time.</i>
jovial	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. <i>A jovial old gentleman.</i>
joviality	A jovial nature.
joyful	Full of or producing joy. <i>A joyful occasion.</i>
jubilant	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>

<u>merry</u>	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment. <i>Have a merry Christmas.</i>
<u>pleased</u>	Proud of one's achievements, especially excessively so; self-satisfied. <i>He seemed really pleased that she was there.</i>
pleasure	An activity that affords enjoyment. <i>Pleasure boats.</i>
rapt	Feeling great rapture or delight. <i>He was rapt on high.</i>
rapture	(according to some millenarian teaching) transport (a believer) from earth to heaven at the Second Coming of Christ. <i>The tabloids went into raptures about her.</i>
rapturous	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with rapturous applause.</i>
