<b>attractive</b>	(of a person) appealing to look at; sexually alluring. <i>A remarkably <b>attractive</b> young man.</i>
<b>blue</b>	Of a ski run of the second lowest level of difficulty as indicated by blue markers positioned along it. <i>The clear <b>blue</b> sky.</i>
<b>colourful</b>	Having striking color. <i>She made it clear in <b>colourful</b> language that she did not wish to talk to the police.</i>
<b><u>entertaining</u></b>	Agreeably diverting. <i>Films should be <b>entertaining</b>.</i>
<b>enticing</b>	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>An <b>enticing</b> prospect.</i>
<b>exciting</b>	Causing great enthusiasm and eagerness. <i>One of the most <b>exciting</b> matches I ve ever seen.</i>

<b><u>fascinating</u></b>	Extremely interesting. A <b>fascinating</b> woman.
<b>fat</b>	Containing or composed of fat. <b>Fat</b> chance she had of influencing Guy's decisions.
<b>gamey</b>	Suggestive of sexual impropriety.
<b>gamy</b>	Racy or disreputable. He skips asterisks and gives you the <b>gamy</b> details.
<b>intriguing</b>	Arousing one's curiosity or interest; fascinating. It's an <b>intriguing</b> possibility.
<b><u>inviting</u></b>	Attractive and tempting. The sea down there looks so <b>inviting</b> .
<b>lurid</b>	Glaringly vivid and graphic; marked by sensationalism. <b>Lurid</b> crimes.
<b><u>luscious</u></b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. A <b>luscious</b> and fragrant dessert wine.
<b><u>lush</u></b>	Tender and full of juice. <b>Lush</b> greenery and cultivated fields.
<b><u>moist</u></b>	(of the eyes) wet with tears. The <b>moist</b> fertile soil.
<b><u>naughty</u></b>	Badly behaved. <b>Naughty</b> words.
<b>red-hot</b>	Newest or most recent.
<b><u>risque</u></b>	Suggestive of sexual impropriety. A <b>risque</b> story.
<b><u>seductive</u></b>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. A <b>seductive</b> voice.
<b><u>sensational</u></b>	Presenting information in a way that is intended to provoke public interest and excitement, at the expense of accuracy. Cheap <b>sensational</b> periodicals.
<b><u>spicy</u></b>	Flavoured with or fragrant with spice. <b>Spicy</b> jokes and suggestive songs.
<b><u>succulent</u></b>	(of a plant, especially a xerophyte) having thick fleshy leaves or stems adapted to storing water. The ever increasing popularity of <b>succulent</b> plants.
<b><u>tempting</u></b>	Very pleasantly inviting. A <b>tempting</b> financial offer.

- tender** Physically untoughened.  
*A **tender** heart.*
- thrilling** Causing excitement and pleasure; exhilarating.  
*It s very **thrilling** to be here and to congratulate the team on another splendid success.*
- toothsome** (of food) temptingly tasty.  
*A **toothsome** morsel.*
- very interesting** Being the exact same one; not any other.
- voluptuous** Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses.  
*Long curtains in **voluptuous** crimson velvet.*

## Associations of "Juicy" (30 Words)

- apple** Used in names of unrelated fruits or other plant growths that resemble apples in some way e g custard apple oak apple.
- beverage** Any liquid suitable for drinking.  
*May I take your **beverage** order.*
- blended** Combined or mixed together so that the constituent parts are indistinguishable.
- blubber** An insulating layer of fat under the skin of whales and other large marine mammals; used as a source of oil.  
*My six pack is quickly being covered in **blubber**.*
- citrus** A fruit from a citrus tree.  
***Citrus** extracts.*

<b>cola</b>	A brown carbonated drink that is flavoured with an extract of cola nuts or with a similar flavouring. <i>A warm can of <b>cola</b>.</i>
<b>drink</b>	The act of drinking alcoholic beverages to excess. <i>Likes a <b>drink</b> before dinner.</i>
<b>flesh</b>	Remove the flesh adhering to a skin or hide. <i>The arguments were <b>fleshed</b> out by the minister.</i>
<b>fleshy</b>	Usually describes a large person who is fat but has a large frame to carry it. <i><b>Fleshy</b> greeny grey leaves.</i>
<b>fruit</b>	Cause to bear fruit. <i>The pupils began to appreciate the <b>fruits</b> of their labours.</i>
<b>grape</b>	A berry typically green purple or black growing in clusters on a grapevine eaten as fruit and used in making wine. <i>An exploration of the <b>grape</b>.</i>
<b>grapevine</b>	Any of numerous woody vines of genus <i>Vitis</i> bearing clusters of edible berries. <i>I d heard on the <b>grapevine</b> that the business was nearly settled.</i>
<b>honey</b>	Of something having the color of honey. <i>Her <b>honey</b> skin.</i>
<b>juice</b>	A drink made from fruit or vegetable juice. <i>Passing through Chicago I was looking for a vape shop to get some <b>juice</b>.</i>
<b>lemon</b>	A drink made from or flavoured with lemon juice. <i>Car makers cannot afford to create <b>lemons</b>.</i>
<b>lemonade</b>	A drink made from lemon juice and water sweetened with sugar. <i>A jug of <b>lemonade</b>.</i>
<b>marmalade</b>	A preserve made from citrus fruit, especially bitter oranges.
<b>nip</b>	A small sharp bite or snip. <i>The Queen s corgis always <b>nip</b> at her staff s ankles.</i>
<b>orange</b>	A butterfly with mainly or partly orange wings. <i>A slice of <b>orange</b>.</i>
<b>potable</b>	Safe to drink; drinkable. <i>There is no supply of <b>potable</b> water available.</i>
<b>raw</b>	Not processed or subjected to analysis. <i><b>Raw</b> sewage.</i>
<b>sip</b>	Drink in sips. <i>I sat <b>sipping</b> coffee.</i>
<b>soda</b>	A sweet drink containing carbonated water and flavoring. <i>In New England they call <b>sodas</b> tonics.</i>

- squirt** A small device from which a liquid may be squirted.  
*She **squirted** soda into a glass.*
- succulent** A succulent plant.  
*A **succulent** steak.*
- sweeten** Make more agreeable or acceptable.  
*There is no way to **sweeten** the statement.*
- tangerine** The citrus tree which bears the tangerine.  
*A **tangerine** evening gown.*
- vegetable** A person who is incapable of normal mental or physical activity, especially through brain damage.  
*I thought I'd sort of flop back and be a **vegetable** for a bit.*
- vinegar** Sour-tasting liquid produced usually by oxidation of the alcohol in wine or cider and used as a condiment or food preservative.  
*Her aggrieved tone held a touch of **vinegar**.*
- vino** Fermented juice (of grapes especially).
