abolish	Do away with. <i>The tax was abolished in 1977.</i>
abrogate	Revoke formally. <i>A proposal to abrogate temporarily the right to strike.</i>
abrogation	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
annul	Declare invalid. <i>Her first marriage was finally annulled by His Holiness.</i>
backdown	An act of backing down. <i>Ministers have avoided sounding triumphal about the association s backdown.</i>
blotch	Cover with blotches. <i>Her face was blotched and swollen with crying.</i>
<u>cancel</u>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i>Cancel the dinner party.</i>
<u>centered</u>	Being or placed in the center.
centrist	A person who takes a position in the political center. <i>A centrist politician.</i>
<u>debatable</u>	Open to discussion or argument. <i>It is debatable whether the country is coming out of recession.</i>
<u>delete</u>	(of a section of genetic code, or its product) be lost or excised from a nucleic acid or protein sequence. <i>If one important gene is deleted from an animal s DNA other genes can stand in.</i>
<u>denial</u>	The action of denying something. <i>It resulted in a complete denial of his privileges.</i>

disproof	A set of facts that prove that something is untrue. <i>Rex was living disproof of the youth preserving powers imputed to life in the college.</i>
dot	Place a dot over a letter. <i>You can turn a reel into a hornpipe by slowing it down a bit and dotting the quavers.</i>
focal	Relating to the centre or most important part. <i>Focal point.</i>
fulcrum	The point against which a lever is placed to get a purchase, or on which it turns or is supported. <i>Research is the fulcrum of the academic community.</i>
nil	A quantity of no importance. <i>They beat us three nil.</i>
nothing	Used to contradict something emphatically. <i>A man who cared nothing for her.</i>
null	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i>The tumour can be more readily identified by nulling the high signal from bone marrow.</i>
nullify	Make of no use or value; cancel out. <i>Insulin can block the release of the hormone and thereby nullify the effects of training.</i>
outlook	The act of looking out. <i>The pleasant outlook from the club window.</i>
override	Be more important than. <i>This commitment should override all other considerations.</i>
refutation	The act of determining that something is false. <i>He fails to give a clear refutation of the argument.</i>
repeal	The action of revoking or annulling a law or act of parliament. <i>The legislation was repealed five months later.</i>
rescind	Revoke, cancel, or repeal (a law, order, or agreement). <i>The government eventually rescinded the directive.</i>
retraction	The action of drawing something back or back in. <i>Prey are grasped between the jaws upon tongue retraction.</i>
revoke	Fail to follow suit when able and required to do so. <i>The men appealed and the sentence was revoked.</i>
speck	Produce specks in or on. <i>The figure in the distance had become a mere speck.</i>

spot Mark with a spot or spots so as to allow easy recognition.
*Her father was at the **spot** with his friends.*

withdrawal The process of ceasing to take an addictive drug.
*The **withdrawal** of legal aid.*
