## Associations of "Jumping off point" (30 Words)

<b>abolish</b>	Do away with. <i>The tax was <b>abolished</b> in 1977.</i>
<b>abrogate</b>	Revoke formally. <i>A proposal to <b>abrogate</b> temporarily the right to strike.</i>
<b>abrogation</b>	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
<b>annul</b>	Declare invalid. <i>Her first marriage was finally <b>annulled</b> by His Holiness.</i>
<b>backdown</b>	An act of backing down. <i>Ministers have avoided sounding triumphal about the association s <b>backdown</b>.</i>
<b>blotch</b>	Cover with blotches. <i>Her face was <b>blotched</b> and swollen with crying.</i>
<b><u>cancel</u></b>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i><b>Cancel</b> the dinner party.</i>
<b><u>centered</u></b>	Being or placed in the center.
<b>centrist</b>	A person who takes a position in the political center. <i>A <b>centrist</b> politician.</i>
<b><u>debatable</u></b>	Open to discussion or argument. <i>It is <b>debatable</b> whether the country is coming out of recession.</i>
<b><u>delete</u></b>	(of a section of genetic code, or its product) be lost or excised from a nucleic acid or protein sequence. <i>If one important gene is <b>deleted</b> from an animal s DNA other genes can stand in.</i>
<b><u>denial</u></b>	The action of denying something. <i>It resulted in a complete <b>denial</b> of his privileges.</i>

<b>disproof</b>	A set of facts that prove that something is untrue. <i>Rex was living <b>disproof</b> of the youth preserving powers imputed to life in the college.</i>
<b>dot</b>	Place a dot over a letter. <i>You can turn a reel into a hornpipe by slowing it down a bit and <b>dotting</b> the quavers.</i>
<b>focal</b>	Relating to the centre or most important part. <i><b>Focal</b> point.</i>
<b>fulcrum</b>	The point against which a lever is placed to get a purchase, or on which it turns or is supported. <i>Research is the <b>fulcrum</b> of the academic community.</i>
<b>nil</b>	A quantity of no importance. <i>They beat us three <b>nil</b>.</i>
<b>nothing</b>	Used to contradict something emphatically. <i>A man who cared <b>nothing</b> for her.</i>
<b>null</b>	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i>The tumour can be more readily identified by <b>nulling</b> the high signal from bone marrow.</i>
<b>nullify</b>	Make of no use or value; cancel out. <i>Insulin can block the release of the hormone and thereby <b>nullify</b> the effects of training.</i>
<b>outlook</b>	The act of looking out. <i>The pleasant <b>outlook</b> from the club window.</i>
<b>override</b>	Be more important than. <i>This commitment should <b>override</b> all other considerations.</i>
<b>refutation</b>	The act of determining that something is false. <i>He fails to give a clear <b>refutation</b> of the argument.</i>
<b>repeal</b>	The action of revoking or annulling a law or act of parliament. <i>The legislation was <b>repealed</b> five months later.</i>
<b>rescind</b>	Revoke, cancel, or repeal (a law, order, or agreement). <i>The government eventually <b>rescinded</b> the directive.</i>
<b>retraction</b>	The action of drawing something back or back in. <i>Prey are grasped between the jaws upon tongue <b>retraction</b>.</i>
<b>revoke</b>	Fail to follow suit when able and required to do so. <i>The men appealed and the sentence was <b>revoked</b>.</i>
<b>speck</b>	Produce specks in or on. <i>The figure in the distance had become a mere <b>speck</b>.</i>

**spot** Mark with a spot or spots so as to allow easy recognition.  
*Her father was at the **spot** with his friends.*

**withdrawal** The process of ceasing to take an addictive drug.  
*The **withdrawal** of legal aid.*
