Associations of "Just as" (30 Words)

applicable	Capable of being applied; having relevance. <i>Gave applicable examples to support her argument.</i>
apposite	Apt in the circumstances or in relation to something. <i>The successful copywriter is a master of apposite and evocative verbal images.</i>
appropriate	Take (something) for one's own use, typically without the owner's permission. <i>The accused had appropriated the property.</i>
apropos	At an opportune time. <i>The composer's reference to child's play is apropos.</i>
barely	Openly; explicitly. <i>She barely seemed to notice him.</i>
coincidentally	In a way that results from chance despite being very unlikely. <i>Her dad coincidentally happens to be the accountant at the bank.</i>
commensurate	Corresponding in size or degree; in proportion. <i>Pay should be commensurate with the time worked.</i>
congruous	Suitable or appropriate together. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i>
decent	Decently clothed. <i>Are you decent.</i>
equal	A person who is of equal standing with another in a group. <i>1 litre is roughly equal to 1 quart.</i>
equally	In amounts or parts that are the same in size. <i>They were equally beautiful.</i>
equitable	Fair and impartial. <i>The beneficiaries have an equitable interest in the property.</i>

evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>A fair fight.</i>
fitting	The action of fitting something. <i>Loose fitting trousers.</i>
germane	Relevant to a subject under consideration. <i>That is not germane to our theme.</i>
<u>identical</u>	(of twins) derived from a single egg or ovum. <i>Four girls in identical green outfits.</i>
<u>justice</u>	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>A tragic miscarriage of justice.</i>
legitimate	Make an illegitimate child legitimate declare the legitimacy of someone. <i>A legitimate male heir.</i>
<u>merely</u>	Just; only. <i>Gary a silent boy merely nodded.</i>
pertinent	Relevant or applicable to a particular matter; apposite. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors pertinent to a situation.</i>
proper	Satisfactorily or correctly. <i>We go to the High Mass with plainsong propers sung by the Ritual Choir.</i>
<u>relevant</u>	Appropriate to the current time, period, or circumstances; of contemporary interest. <i>Her films are relevant for feminists today.</i>
rightness	According with conscience or morality. <i>The rightness of that move for me.</i>
scarcely	Only a very short time before. <i>They scarcely ever used the emergency generator.</i>
seemly	Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous. <i>I felt it was not seemly to observe too closely.</i>
similar	A person or thing similar to another. <i>A soft cheese similar to Brie.</i>
<u>simply</u>	Used to introduce a short summary of a situation. <i>They lived very simply.</i>
<u>suitable</u>	Meant or adapted for an occasion or use. <i>These toys are not suitable for children under five.</i>

Before a time limit expires.

With **timely** treatment the patient has a good chance of recovery.
