Associations of "Just like" (30 Words)

alike	Used to show that something applies equally to a number of specified subjects. <i>They dressed alike in black trousers and jackets.</i>
applicable	Capable of being applied; having relevance. <i>The same considerations are equally applicable to accident claims.</i>
as	A very poisonous metallic element that has three allotropic forms arsenic and arsenic compounds are used as herbicides and insecticides and various alloys found in arsenopyrite and orpiment and realgar. <i>As many as twenty two rare species may be at risk.</i>
coincidentally	In a way that results from chance despite being very unlikely. <i>The report should be published coincidentally with the letter.</i>
commensurate	Corresponding in size or degree; in proportion. <i>Pay should be commensurate with the time worked.</i>
compatible	Capable of forming a homogeneous mixture that neither separates nor is altered by chemical interaction. <i>The printer is fully compatible with all leading software.</i>
conformable	(of a person) disposed or accustomed to conform to what is acceptable. <i>Personalities conformable to the ambient level of cultural evolution.</i>
congruent	Coinciding when superimposed. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely congruent.</i>
congruous	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i>
equal	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>People are born free and equal.</i>
equally	To the same degree (often followed by `as). <i>Deal equally with rich and poor.</i>
equitable	Valid in equity as distinct from law. <i>The difference between legal and equitable rights.</i>

evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>A fair fight.</i>
identical	(of twins) developed from a single fertilized ovum, and therefore of the same sex and usually very similar in appearance. <i>Identical triangles.</i>
indistinguishable	Not able to be identified as different or distinct. <i>The two specimens are actually different from each other but the differences are almost indistinguishable.</i>
justice	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>The justice of his case.</i>
liken	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
literal	Avoiding embellishment or exaggeration (used for emphasis). <i>Dreadful in its literal sense full of dread.</i>
merely	Just; only. <i>Gary a silent boy merely nodded.</i>
preferred	Preferred above all others and treated with partiality. <i>Danny s preferred name is Dan.</i>
proportionate	Exhibiting equivalence or correspondence among constituents of an entity or between different entities. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
rightness	Conformity to fact or truth. <i>They are convinced of the rightness of their theories.</i>
same	Same in identity. <i>His attitude is the same as ever.</i>
scarcely	Used to suggest that something is unlikely to be or certainly not the case. <i>They scarcely ever used the emergency generator.</i>
similar	Resembling or similar having the same or some of the same characteristics often used in combination. <i>Problems similar to mine.</i>
simply	(used for emphasis) absolutely. <i>Quite simply some things have to be taught.</i>
tantamount	Equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as. <i>His statement was tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i>
