## Associations of "Just like" (30 Words)

<b>alike</b>	Used to show that something applies equally to a number of specified subjects. <i>They dressed <b>alike</b> in black trousers and jackets.</i>
<b>applicable</b>	Capable of being applied; having relevance. <i>The same considerations are equally <b>applicable</b> to accident claims.</i>
<b>as</b>	A very poisonous metallic element that has three allotropic forms arsenic and arsenic compounds are used as herbicides and insecticides and various alloys found in arsenopyrite and orpiment and realgar. <i><b>As</b> many <b>as</b> twenty two rare species may be at risk.</i>
<b>coincidentally</b>	In a way that results from chance despite being very unlikely. <i>The report should be published <b>coincidentally</b> with the letter.</i>
<a href="#">commensurate</a>	Corresponding in size or degree; in proportion. <i>Pay should be <b>commensurate</b> with the time worked.</i>
<b>compatible</b>	Capable of forming a homogeneous mixture that neither separates nor is altered by chemical interaction. <i>The printer is fully <b>compatible</b> with all leading software.</i>
<b>conformable</b>	(of a person) disposed or accustomed to conform to what is acceptable. <i>Personalities <b>conformable</b> to the ambient level of cultural evolution.</i>
<a href="#">congruent</a>	Coinciding when superimposed. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely <b>congruent</b>.</i>
<b>congruous</b>	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>People are born free and <b>equal</b>.</i>
<a href="#">equally</a>	To the same degree (often followed by `as). <i>Deal <b>equally</b> with rich and poor.</i>
<b>equitable</b>	Valid in equity as distinct from law. <i>The difference between legal and <b>equitable</b> rights.</i>

<b>evenhanded</b>	Without partiality. <i><b>Evenhanded</b> justice.</i>
<b>fair</b>	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>A <b>fair</b> fight.</i>
<b>identical</b>	(of twins) developed from a single fertilized ovum, and therefore of the same sex and usually very similar in appearance. <i><b>Identical</b> triangles.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not able to be identified as different or distinct. <i>The two specimens are actually different from each other but the differences are almost <b>indistinguishable</b>.</i>
<b>justice</b>	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>The <b>justice</b> of his case.</i>
<b>liken</b>	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>literal</b>	Avoiding embellishment or exaggeration (used for emphasis). <i>Dreadful in its <b>literal</b> sense full of dread.</i>
<b>merely</b>	Just; only. <i>Gary a silent boy <b>merely</b> nodded.</i>
<b>preferred</b>	Preferred above all others and treated with partiality. <i>Danny s <b>preferred</b> name is Dan.</i>
<b>proportionate</b>	Exhibiting equivalence or correspondence among constituents of an entity or between different entities. <i><b>Proportionate</b> representation of a minority group.</i>
<b>rightness</b>	Conformity to fact or truth. <i>They are convinced of the <b>rightness</b> of their theories.</i>
<b>same</b>	Same in identity. <i>His attitude is the <b>same</b> as ever.</i>
<b>scarcely</b>	Used to suggest that something is unlikely to be or certainly not the case. <i>They <b>scarcely</b> ever used the emergency generator.</i>
<b>similar</b>	Resembling or similar having the same or some of the same characteristics often used in combination. <i>Problems <b>similar</b> to mine.</i>
<b>simply</b>	(used for emphasis) absolutely. <i>Quite <b>simply</b> some things have to be taught.</i>
<b>tantamount</b>	Equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as. <i>His statement was <b>tantamount</b> to an admission of guilt.</i>
