## Juxtapose as a Verb

### Definitions of "Juxtapose" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “juxtapose” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Place side by side.*
- *Place or deal with close together for contrasting effect.*



## Synonyms of "Juxtapose" as a verb (5 Words)

<b>mix</b>	Mix so as to make a random order or arrangement. <i>Up to eight tracks can be <b>mixed</b> simultaneously.</i>
<b>place close to one another</b>	Recognize as being; establish the identity of someone or something.
<b>place side by side</b>	Assign a rank or rating to.
<b>set close to one another</b>	Urge to attack someone.
<b>set side by side</b>	Estimate.

## Usage Examples of "Juxtapose" as a verb

- *The fauvists juxtaposed strong colors.*
- *Black-and-white photos of slums were starkly juxtaposed with colour images.*

## Associations of "Juxtapose" (30 Words)

<b>abut</b>	(of a building or an area of land) be next to or have a common boundary with. <i>Masonry may crumble where a roof <b>abuts</b> it.</i>
<b>adjacent</b>	(of a pair of angles) formed on the same side of a straight line when intersected by another line. <i>New York and <b>adjacent</b> cities.</i>
<b>adjoin</b>	Attach or add. <i>The dining room <b>adjoins</b> a conservatory.</i>
<b>after</b>	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>Duke Frederick died soon <b>after</b>.</i>
<b>at</b>	100 at equal 1 kip in Laos.
<b>distal</b>	Relating to or denoting the outer part of an area affected by geological activity. <i>The <b>distal</b> zone is characterized by pyroclastic flow deposits.</i>
<b>eastern</b>	Of or characteristic of eastern regions of the United States. <i>An <b>eastern</b> wind.</i>
<b>edge</b>	Provide with an edge. <i>The economy was teetering on the <b>edge</b> of recession.</i>
<b>extremity</b>	A condition of extreme adversity. <i>The peninsula s western <b>extremity</b>.</i>
<b>flank</b>	A cut of meat from the flank of an animal. <i>A <b>flanking</b> attack from the north east.</i>
<b>heap</b>	Form a heap. <i>A <b>heap</b> of cardboard boxes.</i>
<b>henceforth</b>	From this time forth; from now on. <i><b>Henceforth</b> parties which fail to get 5 of the vote will not be represented in parliament.</i>
<b>lateral</b>	A lateral consonant. <i><b>Lateral</b> sclerosis.</i>

<b>laterally</b>	In a lateral direction or location. <i>Think <b>laterally</b> about new ways of using limited resources.</i>
<b>latticed</b>	Having a pattern of fretwork or latticework. <i>A <b>latticed</b> screen.</i>
<b>medial</b>	(of a vowel) pronounced in the middle of the mouth; central. <i>A <b>medial</b> consonant.</i>
<b>montage</b>	A sequence of film made using the technique of montage. <i><b>Montage</b> was a useful device for overcoming the drawbacks of silent film.</i>
<b>near</b>	Come near to approach. <i><b>Near</b> neighbors.</i>
<b>next</b>	The next person or thing. <i>The <b>next</b> item on the list.</i>
<b>ordered</b>	Having a systematic arrangement; especially having elements succeeding in order according to rule. <i>An <b>ordered</b> sequence.</i>
<b>photo</b>	A photo finish. <i>Do we wait till you've had him <b>photoed</b>.</i>
<b>position</b>	An opinion that is held in opposition to another in an argument or dispute. <i>The guns were shelling the German <b>positions</b>.</i>
<b>postmodern</b>	Relating to or characterized by postmodernism especially in being self referential. <i><b>Postmodernist</b> architecture.</i>
<b>purlieu</b>	The area near or surrounding a place. <i>The photogenic <b>purlieus</b> of Cambridge.</i>
<b>quadrilateral</b>	Having four sides.
<b>side</b>	The amount of writing needed to fill one side of a sheet of paper. <i>The hills that <b>side</b> a long valley.</i>
<b>sometime</b>	Occasional. <i>The Emperor Constantine used this speech <b>sometime</b> unto his bishops.</i>
<b>subsequently</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The officer decided to stop and <b>subsequently</b> made an arrest.</i>
<b>superimpose</b>	Place on top of. <i>The number will appear on the screen <b>superimposed</b> on a flashing button.</i>
<b>then</b>	In that case or as a consequence. <i>We watched the late movie and <b>then</b> went to bed.</i>
