### fate

An event (or a course of events) that will inevitably happen in the future.  
*The guards led her to her **fate**.*

*He is credited with turning round the company's **fortunes**.*

### **god's will**

A legal document declaring a person's wishes regarding the disposal of their property when they die.

### kismet

(Islam) the will of Allah.

The choice resulting from deciding something by lot.  
*He bought a **lot** on the lake.*

<b>one's doom</b>	An unpleasant or disastrous destiny.
<b>one's lot</b>	Your overall circumstances or condition in life (including everything that happens to you).
<b>one's lot in life</b>	Your overall circumstances or condition in life (including everything that happens to you).
<b>one's portion</b>	Your overall circumstances or condition in life (including everything that happens to you).
<b>predestination</b>	Previous determination as if by destiny or fate.
<b>predetermination</b>	The act of determining or ordaining in advance what is to take place. <i>He entered the argument with a <b>predetermination</b> to prove me wrong.</i>
<b>preordination</b>	Being determined in advance; especially the doctrine (usually associated with Calvin) that God has foreordained every event throughout eternity (including the final salvation of mankind). <i>Divine perfection and <b>preordination</b>.</i>
<b><u>providence</u></b>	A manifestation of God's foresightful care for his creatures. <i>They found their trust in divine <b>providence</b> to be a source of comfort.</i>
<b>stars</b>	The topology of a network whose components are connected to a hub.
<b>the stars</b>	A celestial body of hot gases that radiates energy derived from thermonuclear reactions in the interior.
<b>the writing on the wall</b>	The activity of putting something in written form.
<b>what is to come</b>	A light strong brittle grey toxic bivalent metallic element.
<b>what is written in the stars</b>	A light strong brittle grey toxic bivalent metallic element.

<b>angelic</b>	Of or relating to angels. <i>She looks remarkably young and <b>angelic</b>.</i>
<b>asceticism</b>	Rigorous self-denial and active self-restraint. <i>Acts of physical <b>asceticism</b>.</i>
<b>atheistic</b>	Rejecting any belief in gods. <i>Some were preoccupied with God others were <b>atheistic</b> to the core.</i>
<b>believing</b>	The cognitive process that leads to convictions. <i>Seeing is <b>believing</b>.</i>

<b>cardinal</b>	A deep scarlet colour like that of a cardinal's cassock. <i>His appointment as <b>cardinal</b>.</i>
<b>deist</b>	A person who believes that God created the universe and then abandoned it.
<b>devout</b>	Sincerely earnest. <i>The most <b>devout</b> environmentalist.</i>
<b>divine</b>	Resulting from divine providence. <i>Heroes with <b>divine</b> powers.</i>
<b>enlightenment</b>	The action of enlightening or the state of being enlightened. <i>The key to <b>enlightenment</b> is the way of the Buddha.</i>
<b>fatalism</b>	A submissive attitude to events, resulting from a fatalistic attitude. <i><b>Fatalism</b> can breed indifference to the human costs of war.</i>
<b>fatalist</b>	Anyone who submits to the belief that they are powerless to change their destiny. <i><b>Fatalistic</b> thinking.</i>
<b>foreordination</b>	Being determined in advance; especially the doctrine (usually associated with Calvin) that God has foreordained every event throughout eternity (including the final salvation of mankind).
<b>freedom</b>	The state of not being imprisoned or enslaved. <i>He was a champion of Irish <b>freedom</b>.</i>
<b>heavenly</b>	Of or relating to the sky. <i>Their shampoos smell <b>heavenly</b>.</i>
<b>meditation</b>	Contemplation of spiritual matters (usually on religious or philosophical subjects). <i>The habit of <b>meditation</b> is the basis for all real knowledge.</i>
<b>nirvana</b>	(Hinduism and Buddhism) the beatitude that transcends the cycle of reincarnation; characterized by the extinction of desire and suffering and individual consciousness. <i>The days of socialist <b>nirvana</b> in Europe are over.</i>
<b>paradise</b>	Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace. <i>The surrounding countryside is a walker's <b>paradise</b>.</i>
<b>pious</b>	Devoutly religious. <i>A deeply <b>pious</b> woman.</i>
<b>predestination</b>	Previous determination as if by destiny or fate.
<b>reincarnation</b>	A second or new birth. <i>His <b>reincarnation</b> as a lion.</i>

<b>religious</b>	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience. <i>I have a <b>religious</b> aversion to reading manuals.</i>
<b>reverent</b>	Feeling or showing profound respect or veneration. <i>Maintained a <b>reverent</b> silence.</i>
<b>sacred</b>	Concerned with religion or religious purposes. <i><b>Sacred</b> bread and wine.</i>
<b>saintly</b>	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A crypt for some <b>saintly</b> relic.</i>
<b>sect</b>	A subdivision of a larger religious group. <i>Two of the older <b>sects</b> the Congregationalists and the Baptists were able to increase their membership dramatically.</i>
<b>shrine</b>	Enclose in a shrine. <i>The medieval pilgrim route to the <b>shrine</b> of St James.</i>
<b>synagogue</b>	The place of worship for a Jewish congregation.
<b>theism</b>	The doctrine or belief in the existence of a God or gods. <i>There are many different forms of <b>theism</b>.</i>
