acutely Changing suddenly in direction and degree. *He was acutely insightful.*

- He was keenly aware of his own shortcomings.

<u>acrid</u>	Harsh or corrosive in tone. Her acrid remarks make her many enemies.
<u>acuity</u>	Sharpness or keenness of thought, vision, or hearing. <i>Visual acuity</i> .
<u>acute</u>	Denoting or designed for patients with an acute form of a disease. <i>Acute</i> pain.
acutely	Having a rapid onset. <i>Acutely</i> aware.
astute	Having or showing an ability to accurately assess situations or people and turn this to one's advantage. <i>An astute businessman.</i>
awl	A small pointed tool used for piercing holes, especially in leather.
canine	An animal of the dog family. <i>Canine</i> behavioural problems.
canny	Showing self-interest and shrewdness in dealing with others. <i>Canny</i> investors will switch banks if they think they are getting a raw deal.
clipper	Shears for cutting grass or shrubbery (often used in the plural. <i>A set of hair clippers</i> .
discriminating	Having or showing refined taste or good judgement. <i>He became a discriminating collector and patron of the arts.</i>
fang	An appendage of insects that is capable of injecting venom; usually evolved from the legs. <i>The snake buries its fangs in its victim s neck.</i>
hock	Disable by cutting the hock.
incisive	Suitable for cutting or piercing. <i>She was an incisive critic.</i>
insightful	Having or showing an accurate and deep understanding; perceptive. An insightful parent.
intelligence	Secret information about an enemy (or potential enemy. We sent out planes to gather intelligence on their radar coverage.
keenness	The quality of being eager or enthusiastic; eagerness. <i>He has expressed his keenness to retain his job.</i>
penetrating	Having or showing clear insight. A cold penetrating wind.



perceptive	Having or showing sensitive insight. A perceptive observation.
<u>piercing</u>	Having or demonstrating ability to recognize or draw fine distinctions. <i>Her piercing analysis.</i>
pike	Medieval weapon consisting of a spearhead attached to a long pole or pikestaff superseded by the bayonet.
piquant	Pleasantly stimulating or exciting to the mind. A piquant face with large appealing eyes.
pungent	Strong and sharp. Pungent satire.
scalpel	A knife with a small, sharp, sometimes detachable blade, as used by a surgeon.
scissors	Denoting an action in which two things cross each other or open and close like the blades of a pair of scissors. A dummy scissors from David Thomas deceived the opposition.
<u>sharp</u>	Of a key having a sharp or sharps in the signature. <i>Her face was thin and her nose sharp.</i>
<u>sharply</u>	With speed of perception, comprehension, or response. The new style of Minoan pottery was sharply defined.
shrewd	(especially of weather) piercingly cold. A shrewd east wind.
<u>shrill</u>	A shrill sound or cry. A shrill gaiety.
sickle	A short-handled farming tool with a semicircular blade, used for cutting corn, lopping, or trimming.
whet	Sharpen by rubbing as on a whetstone. Here s an extract to whet your appetite.
