archipelago	A group of many islands in a large body of water. <i>The Indonesian archipelago.</i>
area	A part of an animal that has a special function or is supplied by a given artery or nerve. <i>The dining area.</i>
atlantic	Relating to or bordering the Atlantic Ocean.
beach	Land on a beach. <i>At the water s edge a rowing boat was beached.</i>
coast	Sail along the coast especially in order to carry cargo. <i>They sailed further up the coast.</i>
coastal	Located on or near or bordering on a coast. <i>Coastal waters.</i>
dune	A ridge of sand created by the wind; found in deserts or near lakes and oceans. <i>A sand dune.</i>
estuary	The wide part of a river where it nears the sea; fresh and salt water mix.
eutrophication	Excessive richness of nutrients in a lake or other body of water, frequently due to run-off from the land, which causes a dense growth of plant life. <i>He argued that the controlling factor in eutrophication is not nitrate but phosphate.</i>
foreshore	The part of a shore between high- and low-water marks, or between the water and cultivated or developed land.
gulf	A large difference or division between two people or groups, or between viewpoints, concepts, or situations. <i>The widening gulf between the rich and the poor.</i>
insular	Lacking contact with other people. <i>A stubbornly insular farming people.</i>

<u>island</u>	A thing regarded as resembling an island especially in being isolated detached or surrounded in some way. <i>The island of Crete.</i>
islet	A small island.
isthmus	A narrow strip of land with sea on either side, forming a link between two larger areas of land.
lagoon	A body of water cut off from a larger body by a reef of sand or coral.
littoral	The littoral zone. <i>The littoral states of the Indian Ocean.</i>
maritime	Living or found in or near the sea. <i>A maritime province.</i>
nautical	Relating to or involving ships or shipping or navigation or seamen. <i>Nautical charts.</i>
<u>ocean</u>	A very large expanse or quantity. <i>She had oceans of energy.</i>
peninsula	A large mass of land projecting into a body of water.
peninsular	Denoting or relating to an area of land almost surrounded by water or projecting out into a body of water. <i>The counties of peninsular Florida.</i>
<u>region</u>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>It was going to take in the region of two or three months to finish the job.</i>
seacoast	The shore of a sea or ocean.
seashore	The shore of a sea or ocean.
<u>shore</u>	Serve as a shore to. <i>I made for the shore.</i>
southeast	The southeastern region of the United States. <i>Southeasterly breezes.</i>
strait	(of a place) of limited spatial capacity; narrow or cramped. <i>The road was so strait that a handful of men might have defended it.</i>
tidal	Relating to or affected by tides. <i>Strong tidal currents.</i>
windswept	(of a place) exposed to strong winds. <i>His windswept hair.</i>
