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aegis	(in classical art and mythology) an attribute of Zeus and Athene (or their Roman counterparts Jupiter and Minerva) usually represented as a goatskin shield. <i>The negotiations were conducted under the aegis of the UN.</i>
archive	Put into an archive. <i>Source materials in local archives.</i>
assuring	Giving confidence.
coherence	The quality of being logical and consistent. <i>The group began to lose coherence and the artists took separate directions.</i>
consecutive	In a consecutive manner. <i>We numbered the papers consecutively.</i>
conserve	Protect (something, especially something of environmental or cultural importance) from harm or destruction. <i>Industry should conserve more water.</i>
continuance	The period of time during which something continues. <i>Scheduling trial dates and refusing to grant continuances are part of a judge's prerogative.</i>
continuity	A detailed script used in making a film in order to avoid discontinuities from shot to shot. <i>The BBC continuity announcer.</i>
continuous	Forming an unbroken whole; without interruption. <i>A continuous rearrangement of electrons in the solar atoms results in the emission of light.</i>
fusillade	Fire a fusillade at a place or person. <i>The Mahdi's adherents fusilladed his palace at Khartoum.</i>

incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
maintain	Maintain for use and service. <i>The allowance covers the basic costs of maintaining a child.</i>
maintenance	Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>Crucial conditions for the maintenance of democratic government.</i>
nonstop	A flight made without intermediate stops between source and destination. <i>How many nonstops are there to Dallas.</i>
preservation	The state of being preserved, especially to a specified degree. <i>Food preservation.</i>
preserve	A foodstuff made with fruit preserved in sugar such as jam or marmalade. <i>A fight to preserve local democracy.</i>
recurrence	Happening again (especially at regular intervals). <i>A drug used to prevent the recurrence of breast cancer.</i>
recurrent	Occurring often or repeatedly. <i>She had a recurrent dream about falling.</i>
retain	Continue to have (something); keep possession of. <i>Built in 1830 the house retains many of its original features.</i>
sequence	Play or record music with a sequencer. <i>The content of the programme should follow a logical sequence.</i>
sequential	Forming or following in a logical order or sequence. <i>Sequential processing of data files.</i>
seriatim	Taking one subject after another in regular order; point by point. <i>It is proposed to deal with these matters seriatim.</i>
stabilize	Make stable and keep from fluctuating or put into an equilibrium. <i>Stabilize prices.</i>
storehouse	A large supply of something. <i>Storehouses were built close to the docks.</i>
successive	In regular succession without gaps. <i>They were looking for their fifth successive win.</i>
successively	In proper order or sequence. <i>He served successively as a major and a lieutenant colonel.</i>
sustainable	Conserving an ecological balance by avoiding depletion of natural resources. <i>Our fundamental commitment to sustainable development.</i>

- unceasing** Continuing forever or indefinitely.
*The **unceasing** efforts of the staff.*
- uninterrupted** Having undisturbed continuity.
*Moving midweek holidays to the nearest Monday or Friday allows **uninterrupted** work weeks.*
- uphold** Stand up for; stick up for; of causes, principles, or ideals.
*They **uphold** a tradition of not causing distress to living creatures.*
