<u>aegis</u>	The protection, backing, or support of a particular person or organization. <i>The negotiations were conducted under the aegis of the UN.</i>
archive	Put into an archive. <i>The entire directory will be archived.</i>
<u>assuring</u>	Giving confidence.
<u>coherence</u>	Logical and orderly and consistent relation of parts. <i>This raises further questions on the coherence of state policy.</i>
<u>consecutive</u>	In a consecutive manner. <i>A consecutive clause.</i>
<u>conserve</u>	Preserve (fruit) with sugar. <i>Conserve your energy for the ascent to the summit.</i>
continuance	The period of time during which something continues. <i>The king's ministers depended on his favour for their continuance in office.</i>
continuity	The unbroken and consistent existence or operation of something over time. <i>A firm line of continuity between pre war and post war Britain.</i>
continuous	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>A continuous row of warehouses.</i>
fusillade	Attack with fusillade. <i>The Mahdi's adherents fusilladed his palace at Khartoum.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
maintain	Maintain for use and service. <i>He maintained his innocence.</i>
maintenance	Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>Essential maintenance work.</i>

<u>nonstop</u>	(of a journey especially a flight) occurring without stops. <i>How many nonstops are there to Dallas.</i>
preservation	An occurrence of improvement by virtue of preventing loss or injury or other change. <i>The chapel is in a poor state of preservation.</i>
<u>preserve</u>	Fruit preserved by cooking with sugar. <i>A jar of cherry preserve.</i>
<u>recurrence</u>	The fact of occurring again. <i>A drug used to prevent the recurrence of breast cancer.</i>
<u>recurrent</u>	Occurring often or repeatedly. <i>She had a recurrent dream about falling.</i>
<u>retain</u>	Secure and keep for possible future use or application. <i>She retains a lawyer.</i>
<u>sequence</u>	Arrange in a sequence. <i>They sequenced the human genome.</i>
sequential	Performed or used in sequence. <i>Sequential processing of data files.</i>
seriatim	Taking one subject after another in regular order; point by point. <i>It is proposed to deal with these matters seriatim.</i>
<u>stabilize</u>	Become stable or more stable. <i>Stabilize prices.</i>
storehouse	A large supply of something. <i>Storehouses were built close to the docks.</i>
<u>successive</u>	In regular succession without gaps. <i>They were looking for their fifth successive win.</i>
successively	Immediately one after another. <i>He served successively as a major and a lieutenant colonel.</i>
<u>sustainable</u>	Able to be upheld or defended. <i>Sustainable economic growth.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
uninterrupted	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>An uninterrupted flow of traffic.</i>
uphold	Maintain (a custom or practice). <i>They uphold a tradition of not causing distress to living creatures.</i>
