Associations of "Keep up" (30 Words)

ascend	Travel up. <i>The road ascends to the loch.</i>
ascending	The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>Incomes ranked in ascending order of size.</i>
ascent	An upward slope or grade (as in a road). <i>The first ascent of the Matterhorn.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The specially designed circuit boosts signal strength.</i>
<u>climb</u>	The act of climbing something. <i>How old will these graduates be before they begin a long climb out of debt.</i>
<u>climbing</u>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was climbing especially in the Alps.</i>
<u>elevate</u>	(of a priest) hold up (a consecrated host or chalice) for adoration. <i>He was elevated to Secretary of State.</i>
elevator	The airfoil on the tailplane of an aircraft that makes it ascend or descend. <i>Something in his gait made me sure he was wearing elevator shoes.</i>
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
high	Being at or having a relatively great or specific elevation or upward extension sometimes used in combinations like knee high. <i>The sculpture stood about five feet high.</i>
<u>hoist</u>	Raise (something) by means of ropes and pulleys. <i>She hoisted her backpack on to her shoulder.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>Employees on their way up the career ladder.</i>
lift	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>That night the army came and lifted Buckley.</i>

mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>The mounting of rapid fire guns.</i>
precipitate	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>Excess moisture is precipitated as rain fog mist or dew.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>They are using famous personalities to promote the library nationally.</i>
raise	Raise in rank or condition. <i>It is hoped that the event will raise 50 000.</i>
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>Christ is risen.</i>
risen	Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Organized opposition to authority; a conflict in which one faction tries to wrest control from another. <i>A rising trend.</i>
soar	Rise rapidly. <i>The dollar soared against the yen.</i>
soaring	(of a bird) maintaining height in the air without flapping its wings. <i>Soaring prices.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
underpin	Support with evidence or authority or make more certain or confirm. <i>The theme of honour underpinning the two books.</i>
uphill	An upward slope. <i>Follow the track uphill.</i>
upstairs	On or of upper floors of a building. <i>No one was allowed to see the upstairs.</i>
upward	Spatially or metaphorically from a lower to a higher position. <i>The cards were face upward.</i>
vertically	(with reference to passage of diseases) from one generation to the next. <i>The bacteria are vertically transmitted from mother to offspring.</i>
zoom	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The share index zoomed by about 136 points.</i>
