## The Forms of Ken

Infinitive	<b>to ken</b>
Present Tense	<b>ken / kens</b>
Past Tense	<b>kenned or kent</b>
Present Participle	<b>kenning</b>
Past Participle	<b>kenned or kent</b>

## Conjugate Ken

**Ken in Present Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>ken</b>	We <b>ken</b>
You <b>ken</b>	You <b>ken</b>
He/She/It <b>kens</b>	They <b>ken</b>

## **Ken in Present Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>am kenning</b>	We <b>are kenning</b>
You <b>are kenning</b>	You <b>are kenning</b>
He/She/It <b>is kenning</b>	They <b>are kenning</b>

## **Ken in Present Perfect Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>have kenned or kent</b>	We <b>have kenned or kent</b>
You <b>have kenned or kent</b>	You <b>have kenned or kent</b>
He/She/It <b>has kenned or kent</b>	They <b>have kenned or kent</b>

## **Ken in Present Perfect Continuous Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>have been kenning</b>	We <b>have been kenning</b>
You <b>have been kenning</b>	You <b>have been kenning</b>
He/She/It <b>has been kenning</b>	They <b>have been kenning</b>

## **Ken in Past Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>kenned or kent</b>	We <b>kenned or kent</b>
You <b>kenned or kent</b>	You <b>kenned or kent</b>
He/She/It <b>kenned or kent</b>	They <b>kenned or kent</b>

## **Ken in Past Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

**Singular**

**Plural**

I was kenning	We were kenning
You were kenning	You were kenning
He/She/It was kenning	They were kenning

**Ken in Past Perfect Tense**

**Singular**

**Plural**

I had kenned or kent	We had kenned or kent
You had kenned or kent	You had kenned or kent
He/She/It had kenned or kent	They had kenned or kent

**Ken in Past Perfect Continuous Tense**

**Singular**

**Plural**

I had been kenning	We had been kenning
You had been kenning	You had been kenning
He/She/It had been kenning	They had been kenning

**Ken in Future Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

**Singular**

**Plural**

I will ken	We will ken
You will ken	You will ken
He/She/It will ken	They will ken

**Ken in Future Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

**Singular**

**Plural**

I will be kenning	We will be kenning
You will be kenning	You will be kenning
He/She/It will be kenning	They will be kenning

**Ken in Future Perfect Tense**

**Singular**

**Plural**

**I will have kenned or kent**

**We will have kenned or kent**

**You will have kenned or kent**

**You will have kenned or kent**

**He/She/It will have kenned or kent**

**They will have kenned or kent**

**Ken in Future Perfect Continuous Tense**

**Singular**

**Plural**

**I will have been kenning**

**We will have been kenning**

**You will have been kenning**

**You will have been kenning**

**He/She/It will have been kenning**

**They will have been kenning**
