<b>continuance</b>	The state of remaining in a particular position or condition. <i>His interests encouraged him to favour the <b>continuance</b> of war.</i>
<b>continuity</b>	The maintenance of continuous action and self-consistent detail in the various scenes of a film or broadcast. <i>A consensus favouring <b>continuity</b> of policy.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	Continuing in time or space without interruption. <i>A <b>continuous</b> row of warehouses.</i>
<b>economize</b>	Spend sparingly, avoid the waste of. <i>I try to <b>economize</b> my spare time.</i>
<b>hold</b>	Support or hold in a certain manner. <i>He has a <b>hold</b> over them.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>let</b>	A period during which a room or property is rented. <i>She <b>let</b> the flat to a tenant.</i>
<b>maintain</b>	Maintain for use and service. <i>The allowance covers the basic costs of <b>maintaining</b> a child.</i>
<b>maintenance</b>	Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>A chance of going to university with fees and <b>maintenance</b> paid.</i>
<b>nonstop</b>	(of a journey especially a flight) occurring without stops. <i>How many <b>nonstops</b> are there to Dallas.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Never ending or changing. <i>He grows <b>perpetual</b> flowering carnations.</i>
<b>preservation</b>	The activity of protecting something from loss or danger. <i>The chapel is in a poor state of <b>preservation</b>.</i>
<b>preserve</b>	A foodstuff made with fruit preserved in sugar such as jam or marmalade. <i>A jar of cherry <b>preserve</b>.</i>
<b>retain</b>	Secure the services of (a barrister) with a preliminary payment. <i>This soil <b>retains</b> water.</i>
<b>retention</b>	The power of retaining liquid. <i>The soil s <b>retention</b> of moisture.</i>
<b>safely</b>	With confidence through being based on good reasons or evidence. <i>You can <b>safely</b> ignore that advice.</i>
<b>savior</b>	A person who rescues you from harm or danger.
<b>storehouse</b>	A large supply of something. <i>An enormous <b>storehouse</b> of facts.</i>

<b><u>subsistence</u></b>	A means of surviving. <i>The garden provided not only <b>subsistence</b> but a little cash crop.</i>
<b><u>sustain</u></b>	An effect or facility on a keyboard or electronic instrument whereby a note can be sustained after the key is released. <i>He sagged against her so that she could barely <b>sustain</b> his weight.</i>
<b><u>sustainable</u></b>	Conserving an ecological balance by avoiding depletion of natural resources. <i><b>Sustainable</b> definitions of good educational practice.</i>
<b><u>unceasing</u></b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b><u>unchanging</u></b>	Showing little if any change. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
<b><u>uninterrupted</u></b>	Without a break in continuity. <i>A convalescent needs <b>uninterrupted</b> sleep.</i>
<b><u>uphold</u></b>	Confirm or support (something which has been questioned). <i>They <b>uphold</b> a tradition of not causing distress to living creatures.</i>
<b><u>upkeep</u></b>	The act of sustaining life by food or providing a means of subsistence. <i>We will be responsible for the <b>upkeep</b> of the access road.</i>
