*The negotiations were conducted under the **aegis** of the UN.*
- archive** Place or store something in an archive.
*The entire directory will be **archived**.*
- bear** Be able to accept or stand up to.
*I cannot **bear** his constant criticism.*
- conserve** Retain (a particular amino acid, nucleotide, or sequence of these) unchanged in different protein or DNA molecules.
*Mom always **conserved** the strawberries we grew in the backyard.*

continuance	The state of remaining in a particular position or condition. <i>His interests encouraged him to favour the continuance of war.</i>
continuity	The maintenance of continuous action and self-consistent detail in the various scenes of a film or broadcast. <i>A consensus favouring continuity of policy.</i>
continuous	Continuing in time or space without interruption. <i>A continuous row of warehouses.</i>
economize	Spend sparingly, avoid the waste of. <i>I try to economize my spare time.</i>
hold	Support or hold in a certain manner. <i>He has a hold over them.</i>
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>
let	A period during which a room or property is rented. <i>She let the flat to a tenant.</i>
maintain	Maintain for use and service. <i>The allowance covers the basic costs of maintaining a child.</i>
maintenance	Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>A chance of going to university with fees and maintenance paid.</i>
nonstop	(of a journey especially a flight) occurring without stops. <i>How many nonstops are there to Dallas.</i>
perpetual	Never ending or changing. <i>He grows perpetual flowering carnations.</i>
preservation	The activity of protecting something from loss or danger. <i>The chapel is in a poor state of preservation.</i>
preserve	A foodstuff made with fruit preserved in sugar such as jam or marmalade. <i>A jar of cherry preserve.</i>
retain	Secure the services of (a barrister) with a preliminary payment. <i>This soil retains water.</i>
retention	The power of retaining liquid. <i>The soil s retention of moisture.</i>
safely	With confidence through being based on good reasons or evidence. <i>You can safely ignore that advice.</i>
savior	A person who rescues you from harm or danger.
storehouse	A large supply of something. <i>An enormous storehouse of facts.</i>

<u>subsistence</u>	A means of surviving. <i>The garden provided not only subsistence but a little cash crop.</i>
<u>sustain</u>	An effect or facility on a keyboard or electronic instrument whereby a note can be sustained after the key is released. <i>He sagged against her so that she could barely sustain his weight.</i>
<u>sustainable</u>	Conserving an ecological balance by avoiding depletion of natural resources. <i>Sustainable definitions of good educational practice.</i>
<u>unceasing</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
<u>unchanging</u>	Showing little if any change. <i>The party stood for unchanging principles.</i>
<u>uninterrupted</u>	Without a break in continuity. <i>A convalescent needs uninterrupted sleep.</i>
<u>uphold</u>	Confirm or support (something which has been questioned). <i>They uphold a tradition of not causing distress to living creatures.</i>
<u>upkeep</u>	The act of sustaining life by food or providing a means of subsistence. <i>We will be responsible for the upkeep of the access road.</i>
