- *A disorderly outburst or tumult.*
- *A commotion or fuss, especially one caused by conflicting views.*

### Synonyms of "Kerfuffle" as a noun (21 Words)

<b>brouhaha</b>	Loud confused noise from many sources. <i>All that election <b>brouhaha</b>.</i>
<b>clamour</b>	A loud and confused noise, especially that of people shouting. <i>The questions rose to a <b>clamour</b>.</i>
<b>commotion</b>	A state of confused and noisy disturbance. <i>Damage caused by civil <b>commotion</b>.</i>
<b>disruption</b>	The act of causing disorder. <i>He gave hints on what industry today he believes may be ripe for <b>disruption</b>.</i>
<b>disturbance</b>	A disorderly outburst or tumult. <i>They were amazed by the furious <b>disturbance</b> they had caused.</i>

<b>flutter</b>	An act of fluttering. <i>Her insides were in a <b>flutter</b>.</i>
<b>furore</b>	An interest followed with exaggerated zeal. <i>It was little thought that they would excite such a <b>furore</b> among stamp collectors.</i>
<b>fuss</b>	Elaborate or complex procedures; trouble or difficulty. <i>They settled in with very little <b>fuss</b>.</i>
<b>hoo-ha</b>	A disorderly outburst or tumult.
<b>hoo-hah</b>	A disorderly outburst or tumult.
<b>hue and cry</b>	The quality of a color as determined by its dominant wavelength.
<b>maelstrom</b>	A powerful circular current of water (usually the result of conflicting tides). <i>The train station was a <b>maelstrom</b> of crowds.</i>
<b>melee</b>	A confused crowd of people. <i>Several people were hurt in the <b>melee</b>.</i>
<b>palaver</b>	Flattery intended to persuade. <i>What a <b>palaver</b>.</i>
<b>racket</b>	A snowshoe resembling a racket. <i>A squash <b>racket</b>.</i>
<b>ruckus</b>	The act of making a noisy disturbance. <i>There s enough <b>ruckus</b> over identity cards.</i>
<b>stir</b>	An act of stirring food or drink. <i>He gives his Ovaltine a <b>stir</b>.</i>
<b>storm</b>	Storm windows. <i>The manager is at the centre of a drugs <b>storm</b> in Germany.</i>
<b>to-do</b>	A disorderly outburst or tumult.
<b>tumult</b>	A state of commotion and noise and confusion. <i>His personal <b>tumult</b> ended when he began writing songs.</i>
<b>uproar</b>	A public expression of protest or outrage. <i>It caused an <b>uproar</b> in the press.</i>
