| clamour | A loud and confused noise, especially that of people shouting. <i>The questions rose to a clamour.</i> |
| commotion | A state of confused and noisy disturbance. <i>Damage caused by civil commotion.</i> |
| disruption | The act of causing disorder. <i>He gave hints on what industry today he believes may be ripe for disruption.</i> |
| disturbance | A disorderly outburst or tumult. <i>They were amazed by the furious disturbance they had caused.</i> |

| <u>flutter</u> | An act of fluttering. <i>Her insides were in a flutter.</i> |
| furore | An interest followed with exaggerated zeal. <i>It was little thought that they would excite such a furore among stamp collectors.</i> |
| <u>fuss</u> | Elaborate or complex procedures; trouble or difficulty. <i>They settled in with very little fuss.</i> |
| hoo-ha | A disorderly outburst or tumult. |
| hoo-hah | A disorderly outburst or tumult. |
| hue and cry | The quality of a color as determined by its dominant wavelength. |
| maelstrom | A powerful circular current of water (usually the result of conflicting tides). <i>The train station was a maelstrom of crowds.</i> |
| melee | A confused crowd of people. <i>Several people were hurt in the melee.</i> |
| palaver | Flattery intended to persuade. <i>What a palaver.</i> |
| racket | A snowshoe resembling a racket. <i>A squash racket.</i> |
| <u>ruckus</u> | The act of making a noisy disturbance. <i>There s enough ruckus over identity cards.</i> |
| stir | An act of stirring food or drink. <i>He gives his Ovaltine a stir.</i> |
| <u>storm</u> | Storm windows. <i>The manager is at the centre of a drugs storm in Germany.</i> |
| to-do | A disorderly outburst or tumult. |
| tumult | A state of commotion and noise and confusion. <i>His personal tumult ended when he began writing songs.</i> |
| <u>uproar</u> | A public expression of protest or outrage. <i>It caused an uproar in the press.</i> |
