- *A hilarious joke.*
- *Someone who causes the death of a person or animal.*
- *An extremely difficult or unpleasant thing.*



Synonyms of "Killer" as a noun (24 Words)

cause of death	Any entity that produces an effect or is responsible for events or results.
<u>destroyer</u>	A small fast lightly armored but heavily armed warship. <i>A destroyer of the environment.</i>
<u>executioner</u>	An official who carries out a sentence of death on a condemned person.
exterminator	A person whose job is to eradicate pests from a building or area; a pest controller. <i>If your house has scorpions call a professional exterminator.</i>
funny story	An account of an amusing incident (usually with a punch line.
grampus	A cetacean of the dolphin family.
jest	An object of derision. <i>Lowly virtue is the jest of fools.</i>
killer whale	Someone who causes the death of a person or animal.
liquidator	A person (usually appointed by a court of law) who liquidates assets or preserves them for the benefit of affected parties.
<u>menace</u>	A threatening quality or atmosphere. <i>The snakes are a menace to farm animals.</i>
<u>murderer</u>	A person who commits murder. <i>Convicted murderers.</i>
orca	Predatory black-and-white toothed whale with large dorsal fin; common in cold seas.
orcinus orca	Predatory black-and-white toothed whale with large dorsal fin; common in cold seas.
peril	A venture undertaken without regard to possible loss or injury. <i>You could well place us both in peril.</i>
<u>plague</u>	A contagious bacterial disease characterized by fever and delirium typically with the formation of buboes bubonic plague and sometimes infection of the lungs pneumonic plague. <i>A plague of locusts.</i>
pleasantry	A mild joke. <i>He laughed at his own pleasantry.</i>
quip	A witty remark. <i>Tricks of controversy and quips of law.</i>
scourge	Something causing misery or death. <i>The scourge of mass unemployment.</i>

sea wolf	A division of an ocean or a large body of salt water partially enclosed by land.
slaughterer	A person who slaughters or dresses meat for market.
slayer	Someone who causes the death of a person or animal. <i>A dragon slayer.</i>
terminator	A person or thing that terminates something.
threat to life	Declaration of an intention or a determination to inflict harm on another.
witticism	A message whose ingenuity or verbal skill or incongruity has the power to evoke laughter. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own witticisms.</i>

Associations of "Killer" (30 Words)

accused	A person or group of people who are charged with or on trial for a crime. <i>Two of the accused were sentenced to thirteen years in prison.</i>
<u>assassin</u>	A member of the Nizari branch of Ismaili Muslims at the time of the Crusades, when the newly established sect ruled part of northern Persia (1094-1256). They were renowned as militant fanatics, and were popularly reputed to use hashish before going on murder missions. <i>His assassins were hunted down like animals.</i>
assassinate	Murder; especially of socially prominent persons. <i>He assassinated his enemy's character.</i>
assassination	The action of assassinating someone. <i>A failed assassination attempt.</i>
assault	A threatened or attempted physical attack by someone who appears to be able to cause bodily harm if not stopped. <i>They left their strong position to assault the hill.</i>
attempted	Tried unsuccessfully. <i>Attempted murder.</i>
conscienceless	Lacking a conscience. <i>A conscienceless villain.</i>
conspirator	A member of a conspiracy. <i>Conspirators had planned to seize the state.</i>
<u>convict</u>	A person who has been convicted of a criminal offense. <i>Twelve people were convicted for their part in an attempted coup.</i>
criminal	Guilty of crime or serious offense. <i>Criminal in the sight of God and man.</i>
culpable	Deserving blame or censure as being wrong or evil or injurious. <i>Mercy killings are less culpable than ordinary murders.</i>
<u>dispatch</u>	Deal with (a task or opponent) quickly and efficiently. <i>He dispatched messages back to base.</i>
exorbitant	(of a price or amount charged) unreasonably high. <i>Exorbitant rent.</i>
genocide	Systematic killing of a racial or cultural group. <i>A campaign of genocide.</i>
hired	Hired for the exclusive temporary use of a group of travelers. <i>A hired assassin.</i>

homicide	A murderer. <i>He was charged with homicide.</i>
killing	The act of terminating a life. <i>A killing joke.</i>
massacre	Inflict a heavy defeat on (a sporting opponent). <i>We haven't been massacred in any game over the last six years.</i>
<u>murderer</u>	A person who commits murder. <i>Convicted murderers.</i>
psychopathic	Suffering from or constituting a chronic mental disorder with abnormal or violent social behaviour. <i>A psychopathic disorder.</i>
regicide	Someone who commits regicide the killer of a king.
serial	A serialized set of programs. <i>Serial processing.</i>
<u>slaughter</u>	A thorough defeat. <i>A magnificent 5 0 slaughter of Coventry.</i>
<u>slay</u>	Be extremely impressive, stylish, or successful. <i>You slayed at this quiz.</i>
slayer	Someone who kills a person or animal in a violent way. <i>A dragon slayer.</i>
suicide	A person who commits suicide. <i>It would be political suicide to restrict criteria for unemployment benefit.</i>
<u>unconscionable</u>	Greatly exceeding bounds of reason or moderation. <i>Shareholders have had to wait an unconscionable time for the facts to be established.</i>
wanted	Characterized by feeling or showing fond affection for. <i>A wanted poster.</i>
