benevolent	Well meaning and kindly. <i>He was something of a benevolent despot.</i>
charitable	Full of love and generosity. <i>They set up a charitable trust to run the hospital.</i>
generous	More than adequate. <i>A generous donation.</i>
good-hearted	Showing or motivated by sympathy and understanding and generosity.
good-natured	Having an easygoing and cheerful disposition.
<u>humane</u>	Having or showing compassion or benevolence. <i>A humane education.</i>
kind	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. <i>Kind words showing understanding and sympathy.</i>
kind-hearted	Having or proceeding from an innately kind disposition.

large-hearted Showing or motivated by sympathy and understanding and generosity.

openhearted Showing or motivated by sympathy and understanding and generosity.
Openhearted advice.

sympathetic Of characters in literature or drama evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings.
Sympathetic neurons.

Definitions of "Kindly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "kindly" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a kind manner.*
- *Please (used in a polite request or demand, often ironically).*
- *In a kind manner or out of kindness.*



Synonyms of "Kindly" as an adverb (9 Words)

affectionately	In a way that displays fondness or tenderness. <i>He treats her affectionately.</i>
compassionately	In a compassionate manner.
good-naturedly	In a good-natured manner.
if you please	Used in polite request.
lovingly	With fondness; with love. <i>They smile lovingly at each other.</i>
please	Used to add urgency and emotion to a request. <i>Rita please people are looking.</i>
pray	Used as a way of adding ironic or sarcastic emphasis to a question. <i>Ladies and gentlemen pray be seated.</i>
tenderly	In a way that is easy to cut or chew; softly. <i>A tenderly funny and poignant love story.</i>

warmly

With colours containing red, yellow, or orange tones.
Dress **warmly** for high altitudes.

Usage Examples of "Kindly" as an adverb

- *Would you kindly explain what you're talking about?*
- *'Never mind,' she said kindly.*

Associations of "Kindly" (30 Words)

affable	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. An affable smile.
<u>amiable</u>	Having or displaying a friendly and pleasant manner. An amiable villain with a cocky sidelong grin.
benefic	Exerting a favorable or beneficent influence. A benefic star.
<u>benevolence</u>	An act intending or showing kindness and good will.
benevolent	Generous in assistance to the poor. A benevolent smile.
<u>benign</u>	Not dangerous to health; not recurrent or progressive (especially of a tumor). The benign sky.
charitable	Relating to the assistance of those in need. A charitable trust.
<u>congenial</u>	Suitable to your needs- T.L.Peacock. His need for some congenial company.
cordial	Strong highly flavored sweet liquor usually drunk after a meal. A tall glass of blackcurrant cordial .
extroverted	At ease in talking to others. She is extroverted confident and gives rousing lectures.
<u>favorable</u>	Encouraging or approving or pleasing. The days were fair and the winds were favorable .
<u>forgiving</u>	Inclined or able to forgive and show mercy. A kindly forgiving nature.
friendly	Kind and pleasant. A friendly neighborhood.

generous	Showing a readiness to give more of something, especially money, than is strictly necessary or expected. <i>A generous assessment of his work.</i>
<u>genial</u>	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>A genial host.</i>
<u>gentle</u>	Make or become gentle. <i>A gentle slope.</i>
goodwill	(accounting) an intangible asset valued according to the advantage or reputation a business has acquired (over and above its tangible assets). <i>The scheme is dependent on goodwill between the two sides.</i>
<u>gracious</u>	Characterized by charm, good taste, and generosity of spirit. <i>Greig was gracious in defeat.</i>
<u>gregarious</u>	Growing in groups that are close together. <i>Gregarious species forage in flocks from colonies or roosts.</i>
<u>hearty</u>	Without reservation. <i>Evening meals of good hearty Swiss cooking.</i>
kindness	A kind act. <i>It would be a kindness on your part to invite her.</i>
merciful	(of an event) coming as a mercy; bringing someone relief from something unpleasant. <i>A merciful god.</i>
<u>mercy</u>	Compassion or forgiveness shown towards someone whom it is within one's power to punish or harm. <i>He threw himself on the mercy of the court.</i>
nice	Pleasant or pleasing or agreeable in nature or appearance. <i>A nice bit of craft.</i>
obliging	Willing to do a service or kindness; helpful. <i>The obliging waiter was in no hurry for us to leave.</i>
philanthropic	Generous in assistance to the poor. <i>Philanthropic contributions.</i>
<u>propitious</u>	Giving or indicating a good chance of success; favourable. <i>Propitious gales speeded us along.</i>
<u>sociable</u>	An S-shaped couch for two people who sit partially facing each other. <i>Enjoyed a sociable chat.</i>

sympathetic

Relating to or denoting the part of the autonomic nervous system consisting of nerves arising from ganglia near the middle part of the spinal cord supplying the internal organs blood vessels and glands and balancing the action of the parasympathetic nerves.

*Hubbell is a more **sympathetic** character.*

treat

An act of treating someone to something.

*The new book **treats** the history of China.*
