- *United States guitar player and singer of the blues (born in 1925).*
- *A piece in draughts with extra capacity for moving, made by crowning an ordinary piece that has reached the opponent's baseline.*
- *A competitor who holds a preeminent position.*
- *Preeminence in a particular category or group or field.*
- *The most important chess piece, of which each player has one, which the opponent has to checkmate in order to win. The king can move in any direction, including diagonally, to any adjacent square that is not attacked by an opponent's piece or pawn.*
- *A playing card bearing a representation of a king, normally ranking next below an ace.*
- *A male sovereign; ruler of a kingdom.*
- *One of the four playing cards in a deck bearing the picture of a king.*
- *United States charismatic civil rights leader and Baptist minister who campaigned*

against the segregation of Blacks (1929-1968).

- *A person or thing regarded as the finest or most important in their sphere or group.*
- *Used in names of animals and plants that are particularly large, e.g. king cobra.*
- *The male ruler of an independent state, especially one who inherits the position by right of birth.*
- *A checker that has been moved to the opponent's first row where it is promoted to a piece that is free to move either forward or backward.*
- *United States woman tennis player (born in 1943).*
- *The weakest but the most important piece.*
- *A very wealthy or powerful businessman.*
- *(in the UK) the national anthem when there is a male sovereign.*
- *(chess) the weakest but the most important piece.*

| liege lord | City in eastern Belgium; largest French-speaking city in Belgium. |
| lion | A celebrity who is lionized much sought after. (in the UK) a title given formally to a baron, and less formally to a marquess, earl, or viscount (prefixed to a family or territorial name). <i>Lords and ladies were entertained here.</i> |

| luminary | A natural light-giving body, especially the sun or moon. <i>One of the luminaries of child psychiatry.</i> |
| magnate | A wealthy and influential businessman or businesswoman. <i>A property magnate.</i> |

| mogul | A steam locomotive of 2-6-0 wheel arrangement. <i>The Hollywood movie mogul Sam Goldwyn.</i> |
| monarch | A nation's ruler or head of state usually by hereditary right. <i>The reigning monarch.</i> |
| <u>overlord</u> | A person who has general authority over others. <i>Charles was overlord of vast territories in Europe.</i> |
| potentate | A monarch or ruler, especially an autocratic one. |
| power | Holding an office means being in power. <i>During his first year in power.</i> |
| prince | A close male relative of a monarch, especially a grandson. <i>He was the prince of a small kingdom that was now part of Pakistan.</i> |
| queen | One of four face cards in a deck bearing a picture of a queen. <i>The queen of ocean liners.</i> |
| rex | A male sovereign; ruler of a kingdom. |
| riley b king | A checker that has been moved to the opponent's first row where it is promoted to a piece that is free to move either forward or backward. |
| royal personage | Stag with antlers of 12 or more branches. |
| <u>ruler</u> | A person exercising government or dominion. |
| <u>sovereign</u> | A nation's ruler or head of state usually by hereditary right. <i>The Emperor became the first Japanese sovereign to visit Britain.</i> |
| <u>star</u> | A conventional or stylized representation of a star typically having five or more points. <i>The captain has a star against his name.</i> |
| <u>superstar</u> | Someone who is dazzlingly skilled in any field. <i>Despite their superstar status the band refuse to change their lifestyle.</i> |
| top executive | Platform surrounding the head of a lower mast. |

A newspaper **tycoon**.

world-beater

A competitor who holds a preeminent position.

| principality | (in traditional Christian angelology) the fifth-highest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy. |
| queen | One of four face cards in a deck bearing a picture of a queen. <i>He insisted the princess could be crowned queen.</i> |
| regal | Of, resembling, or fit for a monarch, especially in being magnificent or dignified. <i>Her regal bearing.</i> |
| regency | The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a regency.</i> |
| <u>royal</u> | A member of the royal family. <i>The royal carriage of a stag s head.</i> |

- scepter** The imperial authority symbolized by a scepter.
- sovereign** Not controlled by outside forces.
A **sovereign** state.
- tyrannize** Rule a country as a tyrant.
*Her husband and mother in law **tyrannize** her.*
- vassal** A person holding a fief; a person who owes allegiance and service to a feudal lord.
A **vassal** state of the Ottoman Empire.
- vicero**y Showy American butterfly resembling the monarch but smaller.
- viscount** A British nobleman ranking above a baron and below an earl.
