Definitions of "Kingdom" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “kingdom” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Heaven as the abode of God and of the faithful after death.*
- *The highest taxonomic group into which organisms are grouped; one of five biological categories: Monera or Protocista or Plantae or Fungi or Animalia.*
- *A monarchy with a king or queen as head of state.*
- *A realm associated with or regarded as being under the control of a particular person or thing.*
- *A country, state, or territory ruled by a king or queen.*
- *A country with a king as head of state.*
- *Each of the three traditional divisions (animal, vegetable, and mineral) in which natural objects have conventionally been classified.*
- *The rule of God or Christ in a future age.*
- *The highest category in taxonomic classification.*
- *A basic group of natural objects.*
- *The domain ruled by a king or queen.*

- *The spiritual reign or authority of God.*
- *A domain in which something is dominant.*

| division | A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>No multiplication or division is necessary.</i> |
| domain | The content of a particular field of knowledge. <i>His domain extended into Europe.</i> |
| dominion | A region marked off for administrative or other purposes. <i>Man s attempt to establish dominion over nature.</i> |
| field | A fielder. <i>The set of all rational numbers is a field.</i> |
| field of influence | Somewhere (away from a studio or office or library or laboratory) where practical work is done or data is collected. |
| group | A combination of atoms having a recognizable identity in a number of compounds. <i>The bulbs should be planted in groups.</i> |
| grouping | A system for classifying things into groups. <i>The grouping of pupils by overall aptitude.</i> |
| land | Extensive landed property especially in the country retained by the owner for his own use. <i>After four weeks at sea we sighted land.</i> |
| nation | The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The news was announced to the nation.</i> |
| orbit | One complete circuit round an orbited body. <i>He plotted the orbit of the moon.</i> |
| province | The proper sphere or extent of your activities. <i>Chengdu capital of Sichuan province.</i> |
| realm | A field or domain of activity or interest. <i>The realm of the occult.</i> |
| sovereign state | A nation's ruler or head of state usually by hereditary right. |
| sphere | The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>The markers on the route included two conspicuous black spheres.</i> |
| sphere of influence | A three-dimensional closed surface such that every point on the surface is equidistant from the center. |

state

The group of people comprising the government of a sovereign state.
*His **state** is in the deep south.*

territory

An area defended by a team or player in a game or sport.
*Woodland **territory**.*

zone

An area or stretch of land having a particular characteristic, purpose, or use, or subject to particular restrictions.
*United are still in the relegation **zone**.*

Associations of "Kingdom" (30 Words)

- annex** An addition that extends a main building.
*The left bank of the Rhine was **annexed** by France in 1797.*
- arabia** A peninsula between the Red Sea and the Persian Gulf; strategically important for its oil resources.
- baton** A staff of office or authority, especially one carried by a field marshal.
***Batons** of cheddar cheese.*
- birmingham** A city in central England; 2nd largest English city and an important industrial and transportation center.
- crown** Ceremonially place a crown on the head of someone in order to invest them as a monarch.
*I was able to see our baby's head **crowning**.*
- diadem** An ornamental jeweled headdress signifying sovereignty.
*He refused the **diadem** of all the Caesars.*

| <u>dynasty</u> | A succession of people from the same family who play a prominent role in business, politics, or another field. <i>The Tang dynasty.</i> |
| <u>emperor</u> | Large moth of temperate forests of Eurasia having heavily scaled transparent wings. <i>He is regarded as one of the greatest Roman emperors.</i> |
| <u>empire</u> | An eating apple that somewhat resembles a McIntosh; used as both an eating and a cooking apple. <i>He encouraged the Greeks in their dream of empire in Asia Minor.</i> |
| enthrone | Install (a monarch or bishop) on a throne, especially during a ceremony to mark the beginning of their rule. <i>The Queen was enthroned more than 50 years ago.</i> |
| <u>imperial</u> | Befitting or belonging to an emperor or empress. <i>The imperial family.</i> |
| liege | A person holding a fief; a person who owes allegiance and service to a feudal lord. <i>The king s lieges.</i> |
| manchester | Household linen. |
| monarch | A sovereign head of state, especially a king, queen, or emperor. <i>This followed an attempt by the deposed monarch to regain his throne.</i> |
| monarchy | The monarch and royal family of a country. <i>The monarchy is the focus of loyalty and service.</i> |
| prince | A male member of a royal family other than the sovereign (especially the son of a sovereign). <i>Arctic char is a prince among fishes.</i> |
| princess | The daughter of a monarch. <i>Is something the matter princess.</i> |
| principality | Wales. |
| queen | One of four face cards in a deck bearing a picture of a queen. <i>She s the official carnival queen.</i> |
| regal | Of, resembling, or fit for a monarch, especially in being magnificent or dignified. <i>Regal attire.</i> |
| regalia | The emblems or insignia of royalty, especially the crown, sceptre, and other ornaments used at a coronation. <i>The Bishop of Florence in full regalia.</i> |

| regency | The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a regency.</i> |
| royal | Established or chartered or authorized by royalty. <i>The royal or crowned heads of Europe.</i> |
| royalty | Payment to the holder of a patent or copyright or resource for the right to use their property. <i>Diplomats heads of state and royalty shared tables at the banquet.</i> |
| ruler | Measuring stick consisting of a strip of wood or metal or plastic with a straight edge that is used for drawing straight lines and measuring lengths. |
| scepter | The imperial authority symbolized by a scepter. |
| scotland | One of the four countries that make up the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland; located on the northern part of the island of Great Britain; famous for bagpipes and plaids and kilts. |
| sovereign | Possessing supreme or ultimate power. <i>A sovereign democratic republic.</i> |
| tyrannize | Rule or exercise power over (somebody) in a cruel and autocratic manner. <i>She tyrannized her family.</i> |
| vassal | A person or country in a subordinate position to another. <i>A vassal state of the Ottoman Empire.</i> |
