Kitchen as a Noun

Definitions of "Kitchen" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “kitchen” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A set of fitments and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen.*
- *A room equipped for preparing meals.*
- *The percussion section of an orchestra.*
- *The cuisine of a particular country or region.*
- *A room or area where food is prepared and cooked.*
- *(of a language) in an uneducated or domestic form.*



Synonyms of "Kitchen" as a noun (6 Words)

- bakehouse** A workplace where baked goods (breads and cakes and pastries) are produced or sold.
- cookhouse** A detached or outdoor shelter for cooking.
*The circus used a tent as their **cookhouse**.*
- cooking area** The act of preparing something (as food) by the application of heat.
- galley** A crescent-shaped seagoing vessel propelled by oars.
- kitchenette** A small kitchen or part of a room equipped as a kitchen.
- scullery** A small room (in large old British houses) next to the kitchen; where kitchen utensils are cleaned and kept and other rough household jobs are done.

- *A fully fitted kitchen at a bargain price.*
- *Kitchen Swahili.*

- bathroom** A set of matching units to be fitted in a bathroom especially as sold together.
*I have to go to the **bathroom**.*
- [bucket](#) Put into a bucket.
*The car came **bucketing** out of a side road.*
- [cabinet](#) (in the UK, Canada, and other Commonwealth countries) the committee of senior ministers responsible for controlling government policy.
*A cocktail **cabinet**.*
- cellar** Store wine in a cellar.
*He spent years building up a remarkable **cellar** of aged Riojas.*
- cleaver** A butcher's knife having a large square blade.
*A meat **cleaver**.*

compartment	A space into which an area is subdivided. <i>A first class compartment.</i>
console	A small table fixed to a wall or designed to stand against a wall. <i>You can console yourself with the thought that you did your best.</i>
cupboard	A recess or piece of furniture with a door and typically shelves, used for storage. <i>A broom cupboard.</i>
dine	Have supper; eat dinner. <i>We often dine with friends in this restaurant.</i>
dishwasher	A person employed to wash dishes.
drawer	A person who writes a cheque. <i>The banker would have rights as holder to pursue the drawer.</i>
faucet	A regulator for controlling the flow of a liquid from a reservoir.
fork	Either of two forked parts. <i>The left fork goes on to the village.</i>
freezer	A refrigerated cabinet or room for preserving food at very low temperatures. <i>The freezer compartment of the refrigerator.</i>
fridge	A refrigerator in which the coolant is pumped around by an electric motor. <i>She put the carton of milk back in the fridge.</i>
furnishing	Accessory wearing apparel. <i>A large room filled with fine ornaments and luxurious furnishings.</i>
hatchet	A small ax with a short handle used with one hand (usually to chop wood).
kettle	The quantity a kettle will hold. <i>A kettle pond.</i>
larder	A room or large cupboard for storing food.
pantry	A small storeroom for storing foods or wines.
plumbing	The work of installing and maintaining a plumbing system. <i>The magazine gives a guide to the tools needed for home plumbing.</i>
refectory	A communal dining-hall (usually in a monastery).
refrigerator	An appliance or compartment which is artificially kept cool and used to store food and drink. Modern refrigerators generally make use of the cooling effect produced when a volatile liquid is forced to evaporate in a sealed system in which it can be condensed back to liquid outside the refrigerator.
restroom	A toilet that is available to the public.

room	The people present in a room. <i>He wandered from room to room.</i>
sofa	An upholstered seat for more than one person. <i>Sofa cushions.</i>
stool	Grow shoots in the form of stools or tillers. <i>Concentrations of the substance in normal stool.</i>
suite	A set of instrumental compositions, originally in dance style, to be played in succession. <i>The Royal Saloon was built for the use of the Queen and her suite.</i>
table	A company of people assembled at a table for a meal or game. <i>The whole table was in gales of laughter.</i>
toilet	Assist or supervise someone especially an infant or invalid in using a toilet. <i>Patients were fed and toileted every four hours.</i>
