## Kitchen as a Noun

### Definitions of "Kitchen" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “kitchen” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A set of fitments and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen.*
- *A room equipped for preparing meals.*
- *The percussion section of an orchestra.*
- *The cuisine of a particular country or region.*
- *A room or area where food is prepared and cooked.*
- *(of a language) in an uneducated or domestic form.*



### Synonyms of "Kitchen" as a noun (6 Words)

<b>bakehouse</b>	A workplace where baked goods (breads and cakes and pastries) are produced or sold.
<b>cookhouse</b>	A detached or outdoor shelter for cooking. <i>The circus used a tent as their <b>cookhouse</b>.</i>
<b>cooking area</b>	The act of preparing something (as food) by the application of heat.
<b>galley</b>	A crescent-shaped seagoing vessel propelled by oars.
<b>kitchenette</b>	A small kitchen or part of a room equipped as a kitchen.
<b>scullery</b>	A small room (in large old British houses) next to the kitchen; where kitchen utensils are cleaned and kept and other rough household jobs are done.



## Usage Examples of "Kitchen" as a noun

- *The dried shrimp pastes of the Thai kitchen.*
- *A fully fitted kitchen at a bargain price.*
- *Kitchen Swahili.*



## Associations of "Kitchen" (30 Words)

<b>bathroom</b>	A set of matching units to be fitted in a bathroom especially as sold together. <i>I have to go to the <b>bathroom</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">bucket</a></u>	Put into a bucket. <i>The car came <b>bucketing</b> out of a side road.</i>
<u><a href="#">cabinet</a></u>	(in the UK, Canada, and other Commonwealth countries) the committee of senior ministers responsible for controlling government policy. <i>A cocktail <b>cabinet</b>.</i>
<b>cellar</b>	Store wine in a cellar. <i>He spent years building up a remarkable <b>cellar</b> of aged Riojas.</i>
<b>cleaver</b>	A butcher's knife having a large square blade. <i>A meat <b>cleaver</b>.</i>



<b>compartment</b>	A space into which an area is subdivided. <i>A first class <b>compartment</b>.</i>
<b>console</b>	A small table fixed to a wall or designed to stand against a wall. <i>You can <b>console</b> yourself with the thought that you did your best.</i>
<b>cupboard</b>	A recess or piece of furniture with a door and typically shelves, used for storage. <i>A broom <b>cupboard</b>.</i>
<b>dine</b>	Have supper; eat dinner. <i>We often <b>dine</b> with friends in this restaurant.</i>
<b>dishwasher</b>	A person employed to wash dishes.
<b>drawer</b>	A person who writes a cheque. <i>The banker would have rights as holder to pursue the <b>drawer</b>.</i>
<b>faucet</b>	A regulator for controlling the flow of a liquid from a reservoir.
<b>fork</b>	Either of two forked parts. <i>The left <b>fork</b> goes on to the village.</i>
<b>freezer</b>	A refrigerated cabinet or room for preserving food at very low temperatures. <i>The <b>freezer</b> compartment of the refrigerator.</i>
<b>fridge</b>	A refrigerator in which the coolant is pumped around by an electric motor. <i>She put the carton of milk back in the <b>fridge</b>.</i>
<b>furnishing</b>	Accessory wearing apparel. <i>A large room filled with fine ornaments and luxurious <b>furnishings</b>.</i>
<b>hatchet</b>	A small ax with a short handle used with one hand (usually to chop wood).
<b>kettle</b>	The quantity a kettle will hold. <i>A <b>kettle</b> pond.</i>
<b>larder</b>	A room or large cupboard for storing food.
<b>pantry</b>	A small storeroom for storing foods or wines.
<b>plumbing</b>	The work of installing and maintaining a plumbing system. <i>The magazine gives a guide to the tools needed for home <b>plumbing</b>.</i>
<b>refectory</b>	A communal dining-hall (usually in a monastery).
<b>refrigerator</b>	An appliance or compartment which is artificially kept cool and used to store food and drink Modern refrigerators generally make use of the cooling effect produced when a volatile liquid is forced to evaporate in a sealed system in which it can be condensed back to liquid outside the refrigerator.
<b>restroom</b>	A toilet that is available to the public.

The people present in a room.  
*He wandered from **room** to **room**.*

sofa

An upholstered seat for more than one person.  
***Sofa** cushions.*

**stool**

Grow shoots in the form of stools or tillers.  
*Concentrations of the substance in normal **stool**.*

suite

A set of instrumental compositions, originally in dance style, to be played in succession.  
*The Royal Saloon was built for the use of the Queen and her **suite**.*

**table**

A company of people assembled at a table for a meal or game.  
*The whole **table** was in gales of laughter.*

**toilet**

Assist or supervise someone especially an infant or invalid in using a toilet.  
*Patients were fed and **toileted** every four hours.*
