bakehouse A workplace where baked goods (breads and cakes and pastries) are

produced or sold.

cookhouse A detached or outdoor shelter for cooking.

The circus used a tent as their **cookhouse**.

 ${f cooking\ area}$ The act of preparing something (as food) by the application of heat.


galley A crescent-shaped seagoing vessel propelled by oars.kitchenette A small kitchen or part of a room equipped as a kitchen.

scullery

A small room (in large old British houses) next to the kitchen; where kitchen

utensils are cleaned and kept and other rough household jobs are done.

larder A room or large cupboard for storing food.pantry A small storeroom for storing foods or wines.

refectory A communal dining-hall (usually in a monastery.
