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## Associations of "Knew" (30 Words)

<b>acknowledge</b>	Show that one has noticed or recognized (someone) by making a gesture or greeting. <i>Henry <b>acknowledged</b> Richard as his heir.</i>
<a href="#"><u>acquainted</u></a>	Having fair knowledge of. <i>They were <b>acquainted</b>.</i>
<b>apprehensible</b>	Capable of being understood or perceived. <i>A bat whirred <b>apprehensible</b> only from the displacement of air.</i>
<b>awareness</b>	Knowledge or perception of a situation or fact. <i>A growing environmental <b>awareness</b>.</i>
<b>cognitive</b>	Of or being or relating to or involving cognition. <i>The <b>cognitive</b> processes involved in reading.</i>
<b>cognizant</b>	Having knowledge or awareness. <i>Statesmen must be <b>cognizant</b> of the political boundaries within which they work.</i>
<b>comprehend</b>	Include, comprise, or encompass. <i>Do you <b>comprehend</b> the meaning of this letter.</i>
<b>comprehensible</b>	Capable of being comprehended or understood. <i>Clear and <b>comprehensible</b> English.</i>
<b>consciously</b>	With awareness. <i>A vicious and <b>consciously</b> dishonest hatchet job.</i>
<a href="#"><u>consciousness</u></a>	The fact of awareness by the mind of itself and the world. <i>He lost <b>consciousness</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>conversant</u></a>	Familiar with or knowledgeable about something. <i><b>Conversant</b> with business trends.</i>
<b>enlightened</b>	People who have been introduced to the mysteries of some field or activity. <i>The more <b>enlightened</b> employers offer better terms.</i>

<b>familiar</b>	Having a good knowledge of. <i>Ensure that you are <b>familiar</b> with the heating controls.</i>
<b>familiarity</b>	Usualness by virtue of being familiar or well known. <i>The unnecessary <b>familiarity</b> made me dislike him at once.</i>
<b>familiarly</b>	In an intimately familiar manner.
<b>identifiable</b>	Capable of being identified. <i>There are no easily <b>identifiable</b> features on the shoreline.</i>
<b>informed</b>	Having or showing knowledge of a subject or situation. <i>Obtaining <b>informed</b> consent from research participants is central to ethical research practice.</i>
<b>intelligible</b>	Well articulated or enunciated, and loud enough to be heard distinctly. <i>A barely <b>intelligible</b> reply.</i>
<b>knowable</b>	Able to be observed, understood, or ascertained. <i>The full extent of the damage isn't <b>knowable</b> in advance.</i>
<b>knowledge</b>	Information held on a computer system. <i>The transmission of <b>knowledge</b>.</i>
<b>perceivable</b>	Capable of being apprehended or understood. <i><b>Perceivable</b> through the mist.</i>
<b>perception</b>	The way in which something is regarded, understood, or interpreted. <i>A man admired for the depth of his <b>perception</b>.</i>
<b>realization</b>	An actual form given to a concept or work. <i>A growing <b>realization</b> of the need to create common economic structures.</i>
<b>realize</b>	Achieve (something desired or anticipated); fulfil. <i>The drawings are expected to <b>realize</b> 500 000.</i>
<b>recognizable</b>	Easily perceived; easy to become aware of. <i>There was no <b>recognizable</b> photograph of him.</i>
<b>recognize</b>	Identify (someone or something) from having encountered them before; know again. <i>They were refusing to <b>recognize</b> the puppet regime.</i>
<b>sensate</b>	Perceiving or perceived by the senses. <i><b>Sensate</b> creatures.</i>
<b>sentient</b>	Consciously perceiving- W.A.White. <i>The living knew themselves just <b>sentient</b> puppets on God's stage.</i>
<b>understandable</b>	Capable of being apprehended or understood. <i>Though his accent was strange the words were perfectly <b>understandable</b>.</i>

**understanding** Characterized by understanding based on comprehension and discernment and empathy.
