acknowledge	Show that one has noticed or recognized (someone) by making a gesture or greeting. <i>Henry acknowledged Richard as his heir.</i>
<u>acquainted</u>	Having fair knowledge of. <i>They were acquainted.</i>
apprehensible	Capable of being understood or perceived. <i>A bat whirred apprehensible only from the displacement of air.</i>
awareness	Knowledge or perception of a situation or fact. <i>A growing environmental awareness.</i>
cognitive	Of or being or relating to or involving cognition. <i>The cognitive processes involved in reading.</i>
cognizant	Having knowledge or awareness. <i>Statesmen must be cognizant of the political boundaries within which they work.</i>
comprehend	Include, comprise, or encompass. <i>Do you comprehend the meaning of this letter.</i>
comprehensible	Capable of being comprehended or understood. <i>Clear and comprehensible English.</i>
consciously	With awareness. <i>A vicious and consciously dishonest hatchet job.</i>
<u>consciousness</u>	The fact of awareness by the mind of itself and the world. <i>He lost consciousness.</i>
<u>conversant</u>	Familiar with or knowledgeable about something. <i>Conversant with business trends.</i>
enlightened	People who have been introduced to the mysteries of some field or activity. <i>The more enlightened employers offer better terms.</i>

familiar	Having a good knowledge of. <i>Ensure that you are familiar with the heating controls.</i>
familiarity	Usualness by virtue of being familiar or well known. <i>The unnecessary familiarity made me dislike him at once.</i>
familiarly	In an intimately familiar manner.
identifiable	Capable of being identified. <i>There are no easily identifiable features on the shoreline.</i>
informed	Having or showing knowledge of a subject or situation. <i>Obtaining informed consent from research participants is central to ethical research practice.</i>
intelligible	Well articulated or enunciated, and loud enough to be heard distinctly. <i>A barely intelligible reply.</i>
knowable	Able to be observed, understood, or ascertained. <i>The full extent of the damage isn't knowable in advance.</i>
knowledge	Information held on a computer system. <i>The transmission of knowledge.</i>
perceivable	Capable of being apprehended or understood. <i>Perceivable through the mist.</i>
perception	The way in which something is regarded, understood, or interpreted. <i>A man admired for the depth of his perception.</i>
realization	An actual form given to a concept or work. <i>A growing realization of the need to create common economic structures.</i>
realize	Achieve (something desired or anticipated); fulfil. <i>The drawings are expected to realize 500 000.</i>
recognizable	Easily perceived; easy to become aware of. <i>There was no recognizable photograph of him.</i>
recognize	Identify (someone or something) from having encountered them before; know again. <i>They were refusing to recognize the puppet regime.</i>
sensate	Perceiving or perceived by the senses. <i>Sensate creatures.</i>
sentient	Consciously perceiving- W.A.White. <i>The living knew themselves just sentient puppets on God's stage.</i>
understandable	Capable of being apprehended or understood. <i>Though his accent was strange the words were perfectly understandable.</i>

understanding Characterized by understanding based on comprehension and discernment and empathy.
