| <u>acquainted</u> | Having fair knowledge of. <i>Fully acquainted with the facts.</i> |
| apprehensible | Capable of being understood or perceived. <i>A bat whirred apprehensible only from the displacement of air.</i> |
| approachable | (of a place) able to be reached from a particular direction or by a particular means. <i>A site approachable from a branch of the Niger.</i> |
| awareness | Knowledge or perception of a situation or fact. <i>We need to raise public awareness of the issue.</i> |
| cognitive | Relating to cognition. <i>The cognitive processes involved in reading.</i> |
| comprehend | To become aware of through the senses. <i>He couldn't comprehend her reasons for marrying Lovat.</i> |
| comprehensible | Capable of being comprehended or understood. <i>Clear and comprehensible English.</i> |
| consciously | In a way that is directly perceptible to and under the control of the person concerned. <i>A vicious and consciously dishonest hatchet job.</i> |
| <u>consciousness</u> | An alert cognitive state in which you are aware of yourself and your situation. <i>His sudden consciousness of the problem he faced.</i> |
| <u>conversant</u> | Familiar with or knowledgeable about something. <i>You need someone who is conversant with the new technology.</i> |
| enlightened | People who have been introduced to the mysteries of some field or activity. <i>We become enlightened in our relationship with God.</i> |

| enlightenment | (Hinduism and Buddhism) the beatitude that transcends the cycle of reincarnation; characterized by the extinction of desire and suffering and individual consciousness. <i>Robbie looked to me for enlightenment.</i> |
| familiar | Often encountered or experienced; common. <i>A familiar everyday scene.</i> |
| familiarly | In an intimately familiar manner. |
| informed | Having much knowledge or education. <i>An informed readership.</i> |
| intelligible | Well articulated or enunciated, and loud enough to be heard distinctly. <i>A barely intelligible reply.</i> |
| intuitively | Without conscious reasoning; instinctively. <i>They intuitively understood each other.</i> |
| knowledge | Information held on a computer system. <i>Her considerable knowledge of antiques.</i> |
| perceivable | Capable of being apprehended or understood. <i>Perceivable through the mist.</i> |
| perception | The way in which something is regarded, understood, or interpreted. <i>He wouldn't have accepted said my mother with unusual perception.</i> |
| predictable | Able to be predicted. <i>The characters are stereotyped and extremely predictable.</i> |
| realize | Make (a profit) from a transaction. <i>The stage designs have been beautifully realized.</i> |
| recognition | Appreciation or acclaim for an achievement, service, or ability. <i>A sudden recognition of the problem he faced.</i> |
| recognize | Express greetings upon meeting someone. <i>We do not recognize your gods.</i> |
| sensate | Perceiving or perceived by the senses. <i>Sensate creatures.</i> |
| sentient | Consciously perceiving- W.A.White. <i>The living knew themselves just sentient puppets on God's stage.</i> |
| understand | Be understanding of. <i>I understand you're at art school.</i> |
| understandable | To be expected; natural, reasonable, or forgivable. <i>It is understandable that mistakes occur sometimes.</i> |

understanding Characterized by understanding based on comprehension and discernment and empathy.
