### **Know in Present Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

Singular Plural

I am knowing We are knowing
You are knowing You are knowing
He/She/It is knowing They are knowing

#### **Know in Present Perfect Tense**

Singular Plural

I have known, knowen (archaic), or We have known, knowen (archaic), or

knowed (dialect) knowed (dialect)

You have known, knowen (archaic), or You have known, knowen (archaic), or

knowed (dialect) knowed (dialect)

He/She/It has known, knowen (archaic), They have known, knowen (archaic), or

or knowed (dialect) knowed (dialect)

#### **Know in Present Perfect Continuous Tense**

Singular Plural

I have been knowing
You have been knowing
He/She/It has been knowing
They have been knowing

## **Know in Past Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

Singular Plural

I knew or knowed (dialect), We knew or knowed (dialect), You knew or knowed (dialect), You knew or knowed (dialect),

He/She/It knew or knowed (dialect), They knew or knowed (dialect),



### **Know in Past Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

Singular Plural

I was knowing
You were knowing
He/She/It was knowing
They were knowing

### **Know in Past Perfect Tense**

Singular Plural

I had known, knowen (archaic), or We had known, knowen (archaic), or

knowed (dialect) knowed (dialect)

You had known, knowen (archaic), or You had known, knowen (archaic), or

knowed (dialect) knowed (dialect)

He/She/It had known, knowen (archaic), They had known, knowen (archaic), or

#### **Know in Past Perfect Continuous Tense**

Singular Plural

I had been knowing
You had been knowing
He/She/It had been knowing
They had been knowing

### **Know in Future Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

Singular Plural

I will know
You will know
He/She/It will know
They will know

### **Know in Future Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

Singular Plural

I will be knowing
You will be knowing
You will be knowing



Singular Plural

He/She/It will be knowing They will be knowing

#### **Know in Future Perfect Tense**

**Singular** Plural

I will have known, knowen (archaic), or We will have known, knowen (archaic),

knowed (dialect) or knowed (dialect)

You will have known, knowen (archaic), You will have known, knowen (archaic),

or knowed (dialect) or knowed (dialect)

He/She/It will have known, knowen They will have known, knowen (archaic),

### **Know in Future Perfect Continuous Tense**

Singular Plural

I will have been knowing
You will have been knowing
You will have been knowing

He/She/It will have been knowing They will have been knowing
