serpentine Resembling a serpent in form.

sinuous Curved or curving in and out.

The **sinuous** grace of a cat.

tangled In a confused mass.

Oh what a **tangled** web we weave.

tortuous Highly complex or intricate and occasionally devious.

The route is remote and **tortuous**.

twisting Marked by repeated turns and bends.

wandering Travelling aimlessly from place to place; itinerant.

His life followed a **wandering** course.

winding Following a twisting or spiral course.

A **winding** country road.

Having the form of a zigzag veering alternately to right and left.

When chased by a predator some animals take a **zigzag** course.
