leisurely Acting or done at leisure; unhurried or relaxed.

A **leisurely** breakfast at our hotel.

lukewarm Moderately warm.

Britain is **lukewarm** about the proposal.

offhand With little or no preparation or forethought.

An **offhand** manner.

relaxed Without strain or anxiety.

A **relaxed** and informal discussion.

. Lacking affection or warm feeling.

uncaring
An uncaring father.

Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or

unconcerned callous.

Scott seemed **unconcerned** by his companion s problem.

Not enthusiastic; lacking excitement or ardor.

unenthusiastic

Unenthusiastic applause.

uninterested Not having or showing interest. *I was totally uninterested in boys.*

exhausted Drained of energy or effectiveness extremely tired completely exhausted.

The day's events left her completely **exhausted** her strength drained.

feeble Lacking strength of character.

By now he was too **feeble** to leave his room.

flagging

Becoming tired or less dynamic; declining in strength.

She wants to revive her **flagging** career.

Filled with melancholy and despondency.

gloomy

A dark gloomy day.

Stunned or confused and slow to react (as from blows or drunkenness or

groggy exhaustion.

The sleeping pills had left her feeling **groggy**.

indifferent Showing no care or concern in attitude or action.

Most workers were **indifferent** to foreign affairs.

languid Lacking spirit or liveliness.

A **languid** mood.

lassitude A feeling of lack of interest or energy.

She was overcome by **lassitude** and retired to bed.



lazy (of a river) slow-moving.

They were enjoying a really **lazy** holiday.

lethargic Affected by lethargy; sluggish and apathetic.

Bullfrogs became **lethargic** with the first cold nights.

lethargy Inactivity; showing an unusual lack of energy.

A history of weight loss **lethargy** and fluid retention.

listless (of a person or their manner) lacking energy or enthusiasm.

He was **listless** and bored.

pendulous Hanging down loosely.

The **pendulous** branches of a weeping willow.

sleepy Inducing sleep; soporific.

He turned off the road into a **sleepy** little town.

sluggish (of business) not active or brisk.

The car had been **sluggish** all morning.

sluggishness The pace of things that move relatively slowly.

The **sluggishness** of the economy.

somnolence A very sleepy state.

somnolent Inclined to or marked by drowsiness. *The sound had a somnolent effect.*

Exhaust or get tired through overuse or great strain or stress.

Automobile **tire**s are usually made of rubber and filled with compressed air.

(especially of a statement or idea) boring or uninteresting because

tired overfamiliar.

Fisher rubbed his **tired** eyes.

torpor A state of physical or mental inactivity; lethargy.

They veered between apathetic **torpor** and hysterical fanaticism.

uninterested Having no care or interest in knowing.

She appeared totally **uninterested**.
