Associations of "Laid out" (30 Words)

aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground nuclear testing.</i>
absentee	One that is absent or not in residence. <i>An absentee from the match.</i>
absenteeism	The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. <i>High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.</i>
armchair	Chair with a support on each side for arms. <i>An armchair traveller.</i>
away	An away match or win. <i>The wedding is only weeks away.</i>
barring	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
bedroom	Denoting a small town or suburb whose residents commute to a nearby city. <i>A two bedroom flat.</i>
besides	In addition. <i>I don t want to go to a restaurant besides we can t afford it.</i>
by	So as to pass a given point. <i>A car flashed by on the other side of the road.</i>
corridor	A long passage in a building from which doors lead into rooms. <i>His room lay at the very end of the corridor.</i>
couch	(in embroidery) fix (a thread) to a fabric by stitching it down flat with another thread. <i>Gold and silver threads couched by hand.</i>
defeatist	A person who expects or is excessively ready to accept failure. <i>We have a duty not to be so defeatist.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>

exclude	Prevent from being included or considered or accepted. <i>One cannot exclude the possibility of a fall in house prices.</i>
<u>exhale</u>	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>The chimney exhales a thick smoke.</i>
furnished	Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority). <i>A furnished apartment.</i>
<u>gone</u>	Having reached a specified time in a pregnancy. <i>She is now four months gone.</i>
<u>hall</u>	A large room in a mansion or palace used for receptions and banquets. <i>Pool hall.</i>
home	Return home accurately from a long distance. <i>There s no place like home.</i>
leave	Leave or give by will after one s death. <i>Leave the room.</i>
<u>omit</u>	Fail or neglect to do. <i>He was omitted from the second Test.</i>
perch	Cause to perch or sit. <i>Eve perched on the side of the armchair.</i>
<u>posture</u>	Assume a posture as for artistic purposes. <i>Politicians have neglected our military posture.</i>
recline	Cause to recline. <i>He tried to recline his seat.</i>
recumbent	Lying down; in a position of comfort or rest. <i>Recumbent statues.</i>
respire	Breathe easily again, as after exertion or anxiety. <i>A country where fresh air seems impossible to respire.</i>
<u>rest</u>	An instance or period of resting. <i>The council has urged the planning committee not to allow the matter to rest.</i>
roommate	An associate who shares a room with you.
sleeping	Lying with head on paws as if sleeping. <i>It was 30 degrees at 1 a m a few weeks ago and sleeping was near impossible.</i>
<u>slouch</u>	A lazy, drooping posture or movement. <i>The lads slouched about the place resentfully.</i>
