Inert especially toward oxygen.

*Severe looking policemen sat astride **noble** horses.*

### **of noble birth**

Impressive in appearance.

### **patrician**

Befitting a person of noble origin.

*A proud **patrician** face.*

**titled**

(of a person) having a title indicating high social or official rank.

*The **titled** classes.*

**upper-class**

Occupying the highest socioeconomic position in a society.

**well born**

Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

<b><u>founder</u></b>	Fail utterly; collapse. <i>An iron <b>founder</b>.</i>

<b>have</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i><b>Have</b> a postdoc.</i>
<b>holder</b>	A smallholder. <i>An umbrella <b>holder</b>.</i>
<b>holding</b>	Books, periodicals, magazines, and other material in a library. <i>Commercial property <b>holdings</b>.</i>
<b><u>host</u></b>	A person who acts as host at formal occasions makes an introductory speech and introduces other speakers. <i>We <b>hosted</b> 4 couples last night.</i>
<b>hostess</b>	A woman host. <i>The perfect dinner party <b>hostess</b>.</i>
<b><u>king</u></b>	Make someone king. <i>The lion is the <b>king</b> of beasts.</i>
<b>landholder</b>	A person who owns land, especially one who either makes their living from it or rents it out to others.
<b>landlady</b>	A landlord who is a woman.
<b>landlord</b>	A landowner who leases to others.
<b>liege</b>	A vassal or subject. <i>One s <b>liege</b> lord.</i>
<b><u>lord</u></b>	Make a lord of someone. <i>Sir Cadwallader Pleadwell has been lately <b>lorded</b>.</i>
<b>master</b>	Someone who holds a master s degree from academic institution. <i>A chess <b>master</b>.</i>
<b>nobleman</b>	A titled peer of the realm.
<b><u>overlord</u></b>	A person who has general authority over others. <i>The Jews rebelled against their Roman <b>overlords</b>.</i>
<b><u>own</u></b>	Have something as one s own possess. <i>For your <b>own</b> use.</i>
<b><u>owner</u></b>	A person who owns something. <i>He is the <b>owner</b> of a chain of restaurants.</i>
<b>possession</b>	The state of being controlled by a demon or spirit. <i>I had no money or <b>possessions</b>.</i>
<b>possessor</b>	A person who owns something or has a particular quality. <i>His father was the <b>possessor</b> of a considerable fortune.</i>
<b>property</b>	Shares or investments in property. <i>The president was concerned about the <b>property</b> across from the White House.</i>

- proprietor** The owner of a business, or a holder of property.  
*Chinese restaurant **proprietors**.*
- proprietorship** An unincorporated business owned by a single person who is responsible for its liabilities and entitled to its profits.  
*Plenty of new firms especially sole **proprietorships** don't make money in their first few years of operation.*
- rancher** A ranch house.
- royal** Established or chartered or authorized by royalty.  
*The **royal** carriage of a stag's head.*
- vested** Fixed and absolute and without contingency.  
*A **vested** right.*
- wealthy** Having a great deal of money, resources, or assets; rich.  
*The **wealthy** nations of the world.*
