<b>highlight</b>	Mark with a highlighter. <i><b>Highlight</b> the area above your eyebrows.</i>
<b>locale</b>	The scene of any event or action (especially the place of a meeting). <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic <b>locales</b>.</i>
<b>macroeconomics</b>	The branch of economics that studies the overall working of a national economy.
<b>natural</b>	A natural note. <i>A <b>natural</b> pearl.</i>
<b>nature</b>	Inborn or hereditary characteristics as an influence on or determinant of personality. <i>They tried to preserve <b>nature</b> as they found it.</i>
<b>painting</b>	Creating a picture with paints. <i>He studied <b>painting</b> and sculpture for many years.</i>
<b>panorama</b>	The visual percept of a region. <i>The tower offers a wonderful <b>panorama</b> of Prague.</i>
<b>panoramic</b>	Including all aspects of a subject; wide-ranging. <i>On a clear day there are <b>panoramic</b> views.</i>
<b>perspective</b>	The relation of two figures in the same plane, such that pairs of corresponding points lie on concurrent lines, and corresponding lines meet in collinear points. <i>We must keep a sense of <b>perspective</b> about what he s done.</i>
<b>picturesque</b>	Suggesting or suitable for a picture; pretty as a picture. <i>A <b>picturesque</b> village.</i>
<b>pomp</b>	Ceremony and splendid display. <i>Entertaining overseas visitors with the right degree of <b>pomp</b>.</i>
<b>scene</b>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>The emergency team were among the first on the <b>scene</b>.</i>
<b>scenery</b>	The painted structures of a stage set that are intended to suggest a particular locale. <i>Spectacular views of mountain <b>scenery</b>.</i>
<b>scenic</b>	Relating to theatrical scenery. <i><b>Scenic</b> drives.</i>

<b>setting</b>	The place and time at which a play, novel, or film is represented as happening. <i>A garnet in a heavy gold <b>setting</b>.</i>
<b><u>spacious</u></b>	(of buildings and rooms) having ample space. <i>A <b>spacious</b> ballroom.</i>
<b><u>spotlight</u></b>	Illuminate with a spotlight as in the theater. <i>The knife flashed in the <b>spotlight</b>.</i>
<b>surroundings</b>	The environmental condition. <i>I took up the time admiring my <b>surroundings</b>.</i>
<b>sylvan</b>	Consisting of or associated with woods; wooded. <i>A shady <b>sylvan</b> glade.</i>
<b>view</b>	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i><b>View</b> a problem.</i>
