Definitions of "Lasting" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “lasting” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Retained; not shed.*
- *Lasting a long time without change.*
- *Enduring or able to endure over a long period of time.*
- *Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place.*
- *Existing for a long time.*



Synonyms of "Lasting" as an adjective (16 Words)

abiding	Unceasing. <i>He had an abiding respect for her.</i>
continuing	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>The act provided a continuing annual appropriation.</i>
deep-rooted	Deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held.
<u>durable</u>	Very long lasting. <i>A durable peace can be achieved.</i>
<u>enduring</u>	Unceasing. <i>He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.</i>
indelible	Cannot be removed or erased. <i>An indelible marker pen.</i>
ingrained	(used especially of ideas or principles) deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held. <i>The ingrained dirt on the flaking paintwork.</i>

<u>lifelong</u>	Continuing through life. <i>A lifelong friend.</i>
long-lasting	Existing for a long time.
long-lived	Existing for a long time.
long-term	Relating to or extending over a relatively long time.
<u>permanent</u>	Not capable of being reversed or returned to the original condition. <i>Literature of permanent value.</i>
persistent	Never-ceasing. <i>The persistent gills of fishes.</i>
persisting	Relentless and indefatigable in pursuit or as if in pursuit.
<u>remaining</u>	Still existing, present, or in use; surviving. <i>Lilly was my last remaining close relative.</i>
surviving	Remaining alive, especially after the death of another or others. <i>There were no surviving relatives.</i>

- *They left a lasting impression.*
- *A long-lasting friendship.*
- *A lasting relationship.*

abiding	Lasting a long time. <i>He had an abiding respect for her.</i>
ceaseless	Constant and unending. <i>The ceaseless thunder of surf.</i>
changeless	Unvarying in nature. <i>Changeless truths.</i>
confirmed	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>A confirmed teetotaller.</i>
constant	(of a person) unchangingly faithful and dependable. <i>A constant lover.</i>
continually	Without interruption; constantly. <i>I was continually moving around.</i>
continuing	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>The act provided a continuing annual appropriation.</i>
continuous	Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity. <i>A continuous rearrangement of electrons in the solar atoms results in the emission of light.</i>
durable	Existing for a long time. <i>Porcelain enamel is strong and durable.</i>

endless	(of a belt, chain, or tape) having the ends joined to form a loop allowing continuous action. <i>We smoked endless cigarettes.</i>
enduring	Unceasing. <i>He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.</i>
equable	Not varying or fluctuating greatly. <i>He could look sterner than his equable temperament would suggest.</i>
eternity	Endless life after death. <i>Symbolic inklings of eternity.</i>
everlasting	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>The damned would suffer everlasting torment.</i>
immutable	Constant and unchanging. <i>The view of that time was that all species were immutable created by God.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
indelible	Not able to be forgotten. <i>The story made an indelible impression on me.</i>
indestructible	Very long lasting. <i>Indestructible plastic containers.</i>
ineradicable	Not able to be destroyed or rooted out. <i>Ineradicable hostility.</i>
invariable	(of a quantity) constant. <i>An invariable rule.</i>
permanence	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration. <i>The clarity and permanence of the dyes.</i>
permanency	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
permanent	Lasting or continuing without interruption. <i>Permanent address.</i>
perpetual	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>A perpetual secretary of the society.</i>
stable	Shelter in a stable. <i>The economy is stable.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>

unchangeable Not changeable or subject to change.
*Personality characteristics are virtually **unchangeable**.*

unchanging Not changing; remaining the same.
*The party stood for **unchanging** principles.*

unremitting Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
***Unremitting** demands of hunger.*
