- Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place.
- Existing for a long time.

deep-rooted Deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held.

indelible Cannot be removed or erased.

An indelible marker pen.

ingrained (used especially of ideas or principles) deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held.

The **ingrained** dirt on the flaking paintwork.



lifelong Continuing through life.

A **lifelong** friend.

long-lasting Existing for a long time.long-lived Existing for a long time.

long-term Relating to or extending over a relatively long time.

permanentNot capable of being reversed or returned to the original condition.

Literature of **permanent** value.

persistent Never-ceasing.

The **persistent** gills of fishes.

persisting Relentless and indefatigable in pursuit or as if in pursuit.

remaining

Still existing, present, or in use; surviving.

Lilly was my last remaining close relative.

Lilly was my last **remaining** close relative.

survivingRemaining alive, especially after the death of another or others.

There were no **surviving** relatives.

enduring Unceasing.

equable Not varying or fluctuating greatly.

He could look sterner than his **equable** temperament would suggest.

eternity Endless life after death.

Symbolic inklings of **eternity**.

everlasting Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers.

The damned would suffer **everlasting** torment.

Constant and unchanging.

immutable The view of that time was that all species were **immutable** created by

God.

incessant Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

The **incessant** beat of the music.

incessantly With unflagging resolve.

She talked about him **incessantly**.

indelible Not able to be forgotten.

The story made an **indelible** impression on me.

indestructible Very long lasting.

Indestructible plastic containers.

ineradicable Not able to be destroyed or rooted out.

Ineradicable hostility.

invariable (of a quantity) constant.

An **invariable** rule.

permanenceThe property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.

The plantity and normal and the duration.

The clarity and **permanence** of the dyes.

permanency The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.

permanent address.

perpetualUninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
