## Lasting as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Lasting" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “lasting” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Retained; not shed.*
- *Lasting a long time without change.*
- *Enduring or able to endure over a long period of time.*
- *Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place.*
- *Existing for a long time.*



## Synonyms of "Lasting" as an adjective (16 Words)

- abiding** Unceasing.  
*He had an **abiding** respect for her.*
- continuing** Without a break in continuity; ongoing.  
*The act provided a **continuing** annual appropriation.*
- deep-rooted** Deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held.
- durable** Very long lasting.  
*A **durable** peace can be achieved.*
- enduring** Unceasing.  
*He formed a number of **enduring** relationships with women.*
- indelible** Cannot be removed or erased.  
*An **indelible** marker pen.*
- ingrained** (used especially of ideas or principles) deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held.  
*The **ingrained** dirt on the flaking paintwork.*

<b><u>lifelong</u></b>	Continuing through life. <i>A <b>lifelong</b> friend.</i>
<b>long-lasting</b>	Existing for a long time.
<b>long-lived</b>	Existing for a long time.
<b>long-term</b>	Relating to or extending over a relatively long time.
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	Not capable of being reversed or returned to the original condition. <i>Literature of <b>permanent</b> value.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Never-ceasing. <i>The <b>persistent</b> gills of fishes.</i>
<b>persisting</b>	Relentless and indefatigable in pursuit or as if in pursuit.
<b><u>remaining</u></b>	Still existing, present, or in use; surviving. <i>Lilly was my last <b>remaining</b> close relative.</i>
<b>surviving</b>	Remaining alive, especially after the death of another or others. <i>There were no <b>surviving</b> relatives.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Lasting" as an adjective

- *They left a lasting impression.*
- *A long-lasting friendship.*
- *A lasting relationship.*



## Associations of "Lasting" (30 Words)

<b>abiding</b>	Lasting a long time. <i>He had an <b>abiding</b> respect for her.</i>
<b>ceaseless</b>	Constant and unending. <i>The <b>ceaseless</b> thunder of surf.</i>
<b>changeless</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>confirmed</b>	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>A <b>confirmed</b> teetotaller.</i>
<b>constant</b>	(of a person) unchangingly faithful and dependable. <i>A <b>constant</b> lover.</i>
<b>continually</b>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>
<b>continuing</b>	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>The act provided a <b>continuing</b> annual appropriation.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity. <i>A <b>continuous</b> rearrangement of electrons in the solar atoms results in the emission of light.</i>
<b>durable</b>	Existing for a long time. <i>Porcelain enamel is strong and <b>durable</b>.</i>

<b>endless</b>	(of a belt, chain, or tape) having the ends joined to form a loop allowing continuous action. <i>We smoked <b>endless</b> cigarettes.</i>
<b>enduring</b>	Unceasing. <i>He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.</i>
<b>equable</b>	Not varying or fluctuating greatly. <i>He could look sterner than his <b>equable</b> temperament would suggest.</i>
<b>eternity</b>	Endless life after death. <i>Symbolic inklings of <b>eternity</b>.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>The damned would suffer <b>everlasting</b> torment.</i>
<b>immutable</b>	Constant and unchanging. <i>The view of that time was that all species were <b>immutable</b> created by God.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>indelible</b>	Not able to be forgotten. <i>The story made an <b>indelible</b> impression on me.</i>
<b>indestructible</b>	Very long lasting. <i><b>Indestructible</b> plastic containers.</i>
<b>ineradicable</b>	Not able to be destroyed or rooted out. <i><b>Ineradicable</b> hostility.</i>
<b>invariable</b>	(of a quantity) constant. <i>An <b>invariable</b> rule.</i>
<b>permanence</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration. <i>The clarity and <b>permanence</b> of the dyes.</i>
<b>permanency</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<b>permanent</b>	Lasting or continuing without interruption. <i><b>Permanent</b> address.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>A <b>perpetual</b> secretary of the society.</i>
<b>stable</b>	Shelter in a stable. <i>The economy is <b>stable</b>.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>

- unchangeable** Not changeable or subject to change.  
*Personality characteristics are virtually **unchangeable**.*
- unchanging** Not changing; remaining the same.  
*The party stood for **unchanging** principles.*
- unremitting** Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.  
***Unremitting** demands of hunger.*
